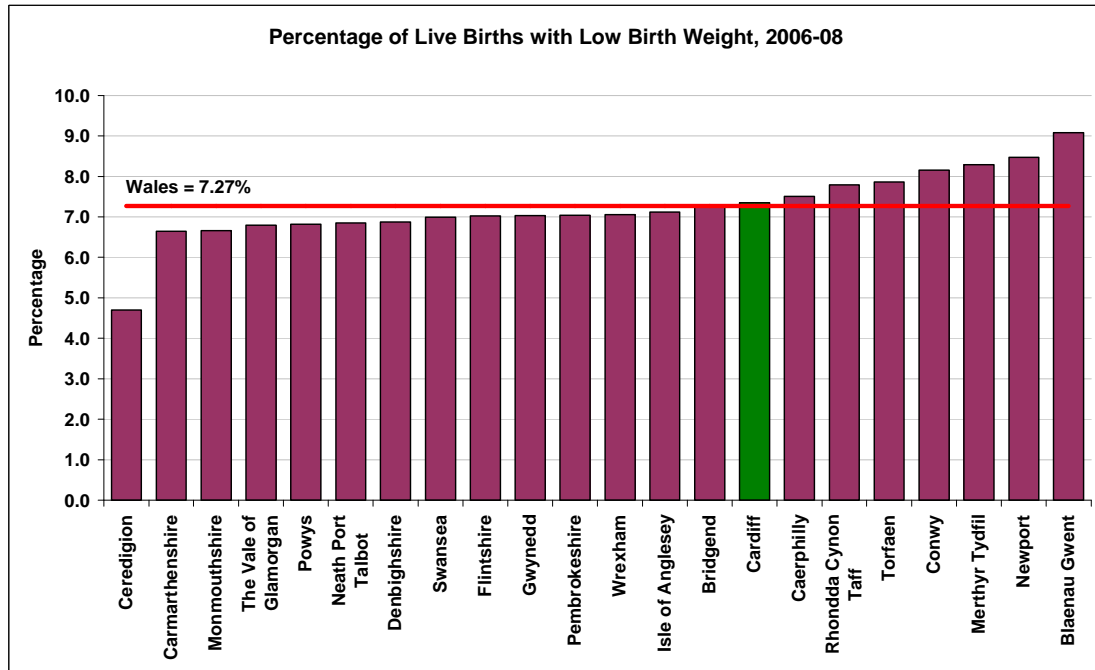


CORE AIM 1

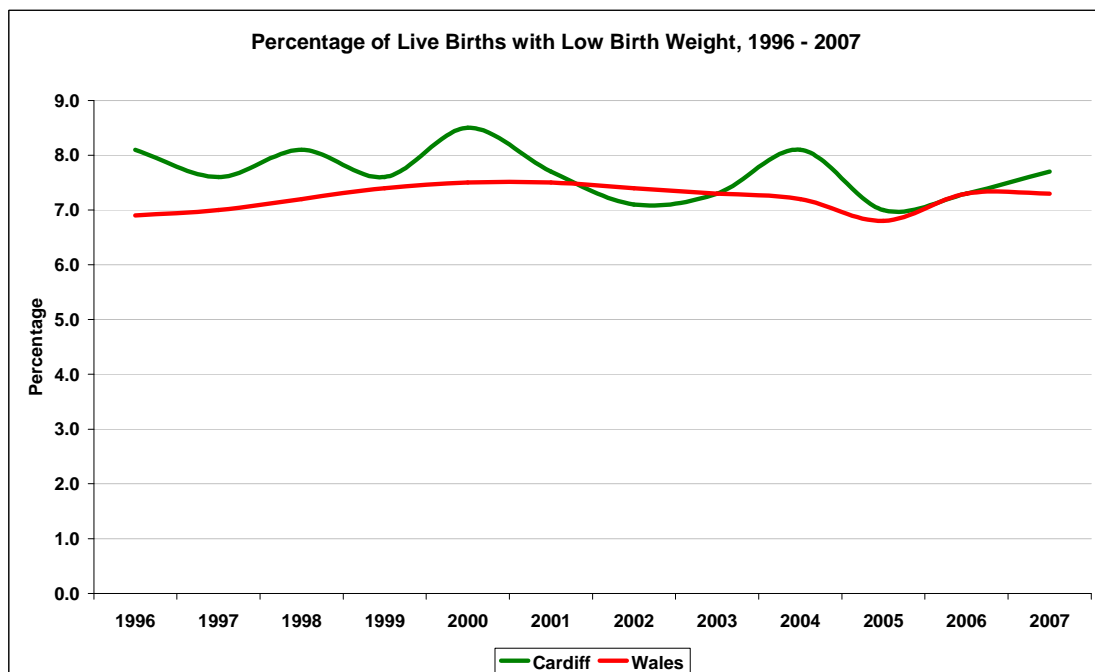
Low Birth Weight

For the three-year period of 2006 to 2008, 7.35% of live births in Cardiff had a low birth weight (i.e. below 2.5kg). This was the 8th highest percentage in Wales and above the national average of 7.27%.

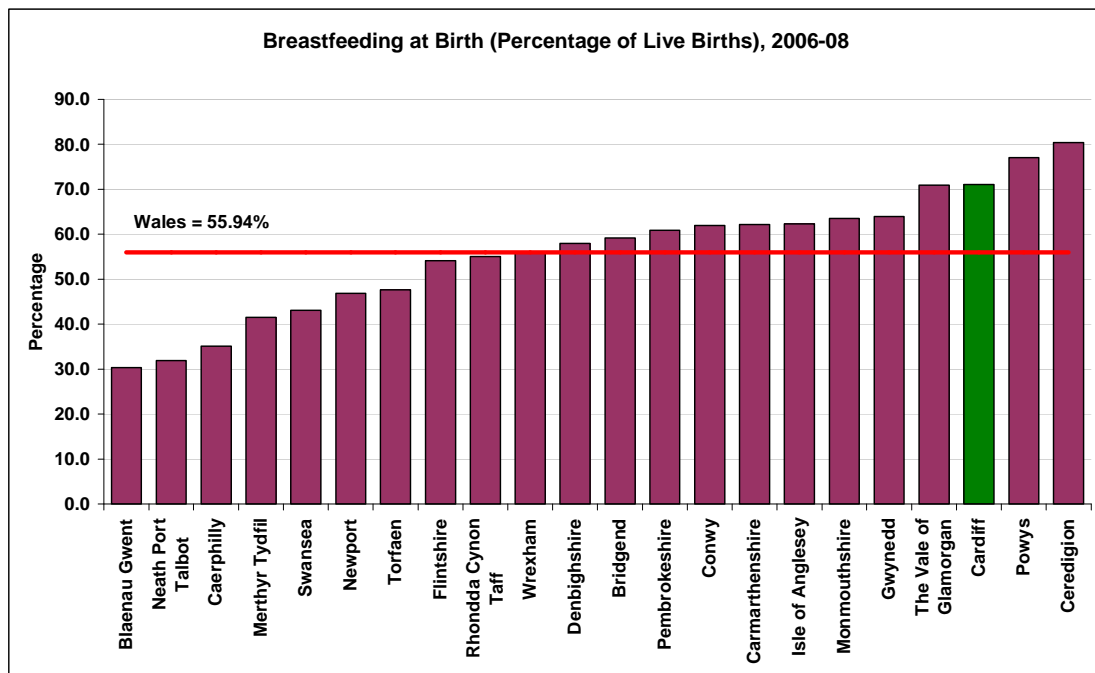
Since 1996 the annual percentage of live births with a low birth weight in Cardiff has predominantly exceeded the equivalent figure for Wales.

Breastfeeding

For the period of 2006 to 2008, Cardiff had the third highest rate (71.09% of live births) of breastfeeding at birth in Wales and was significantly above the national average of 55.94%. This was an improvement on 2003 to 2005 when its rate of 70.20% was the fourth highest in Wales, behind the Vale of Glamorgan, Powys and Ceredigion. In comparison the Wales average was just 53.86%.

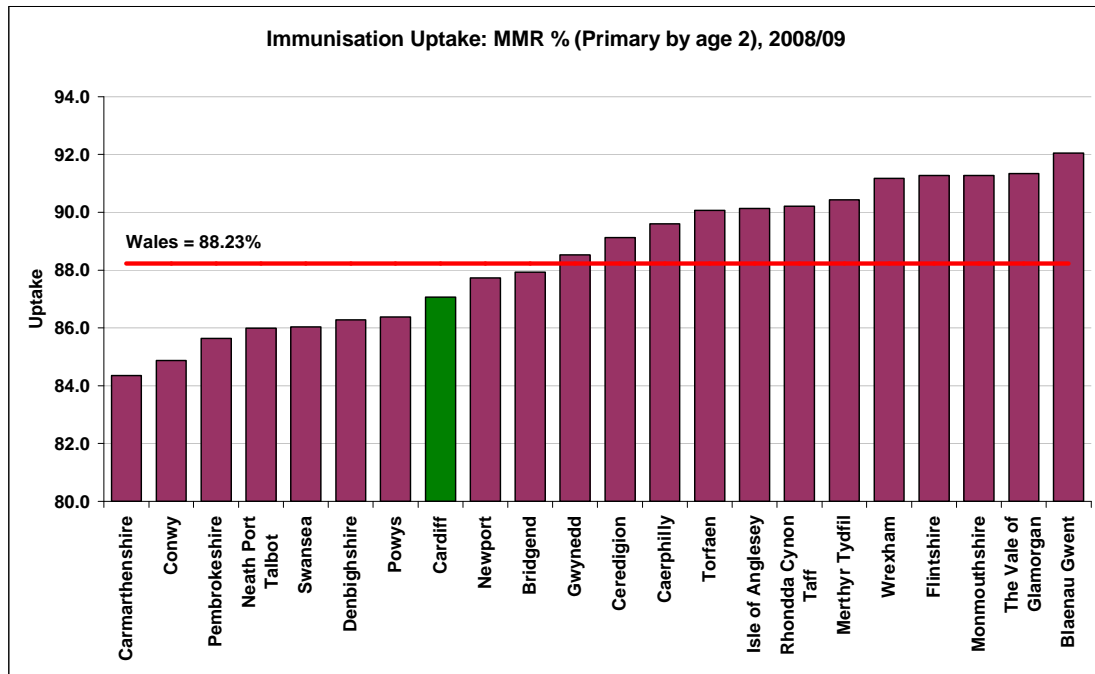

Immunisation Uptake

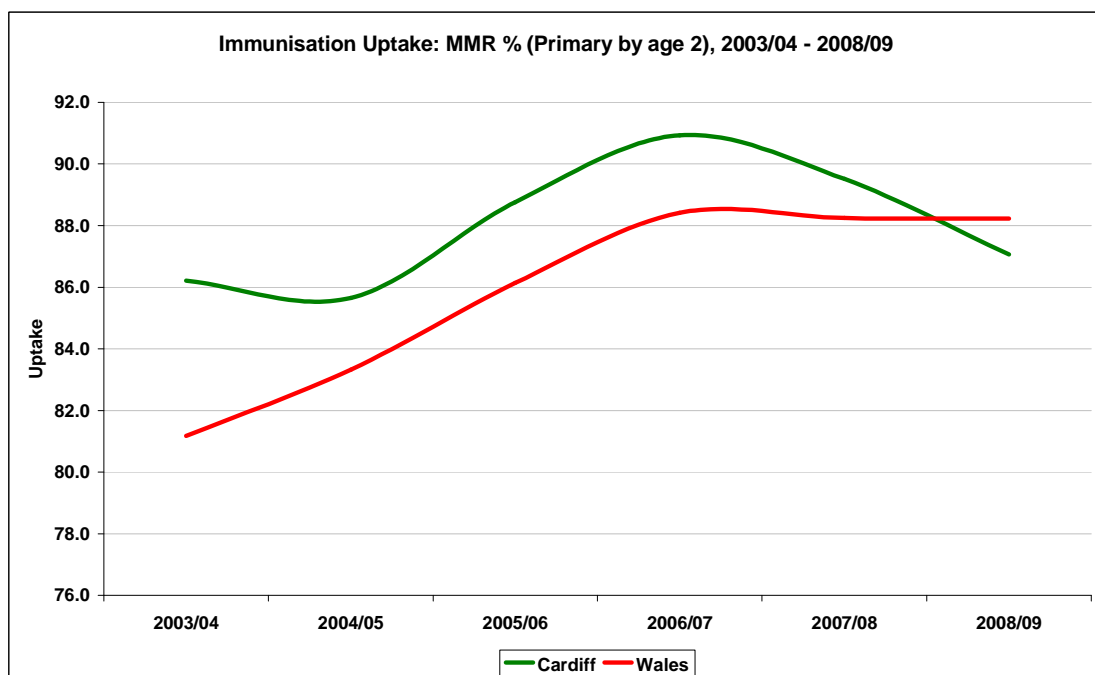
MMR

The immunisation uptake rate for MMR (primary vaccination by age 2) in Cardiff was 87.06% in 2008/09. This was the 8th lowest rate in Wales and also compared poorly with the national average of 88.23%.

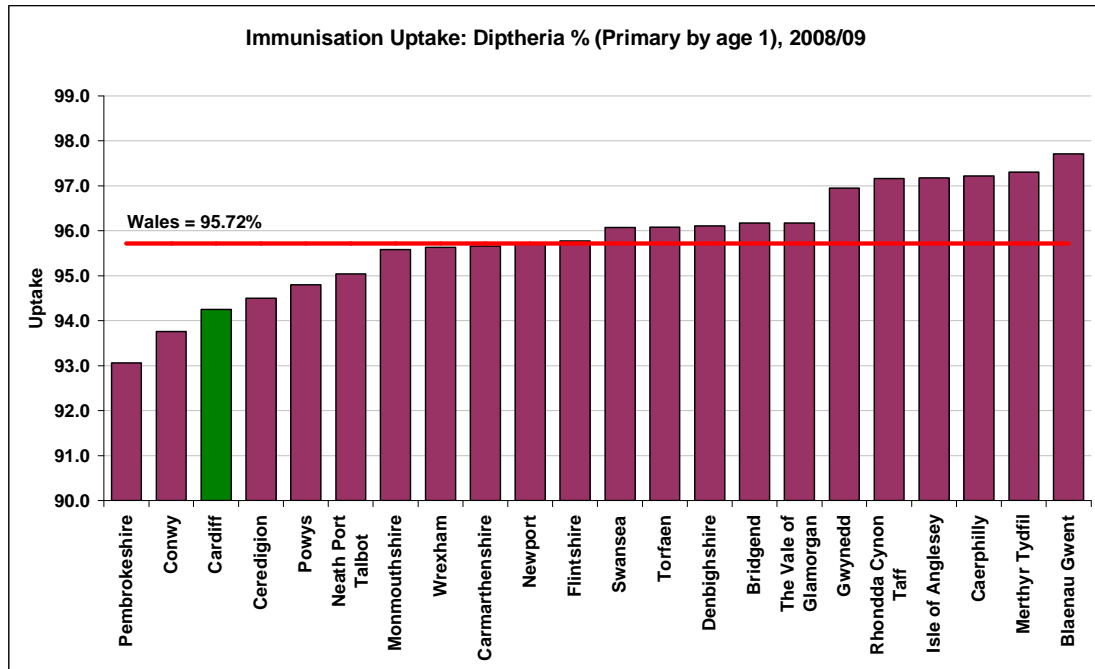
In 2003/04, Cardiff had the second highest MMR immunisation uptake rate in Wales and until 2007/08 was consistently above the national average. However, in 2008/09 it fell below the Wales rate.

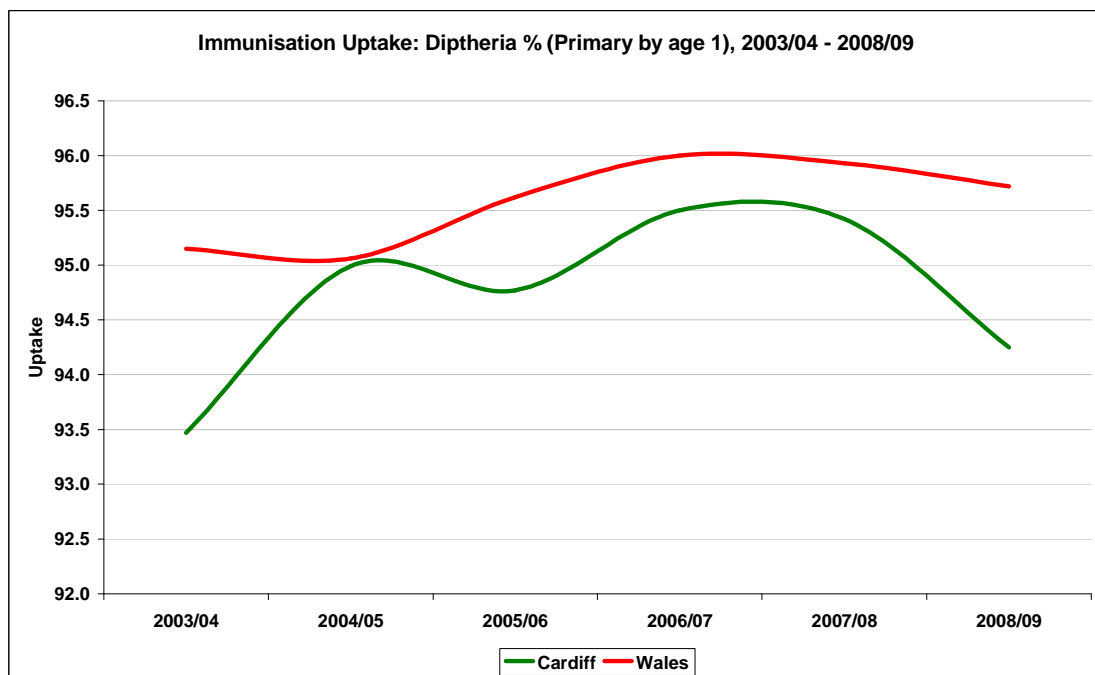
Diphtheria

The immunisation uptake rate for diphtheria (primary vaccination by age 1) in Cardiff was 94.25% in 2008/09. This was the 3rd lowest rate in Wales and also was below the national average of 95.72%.

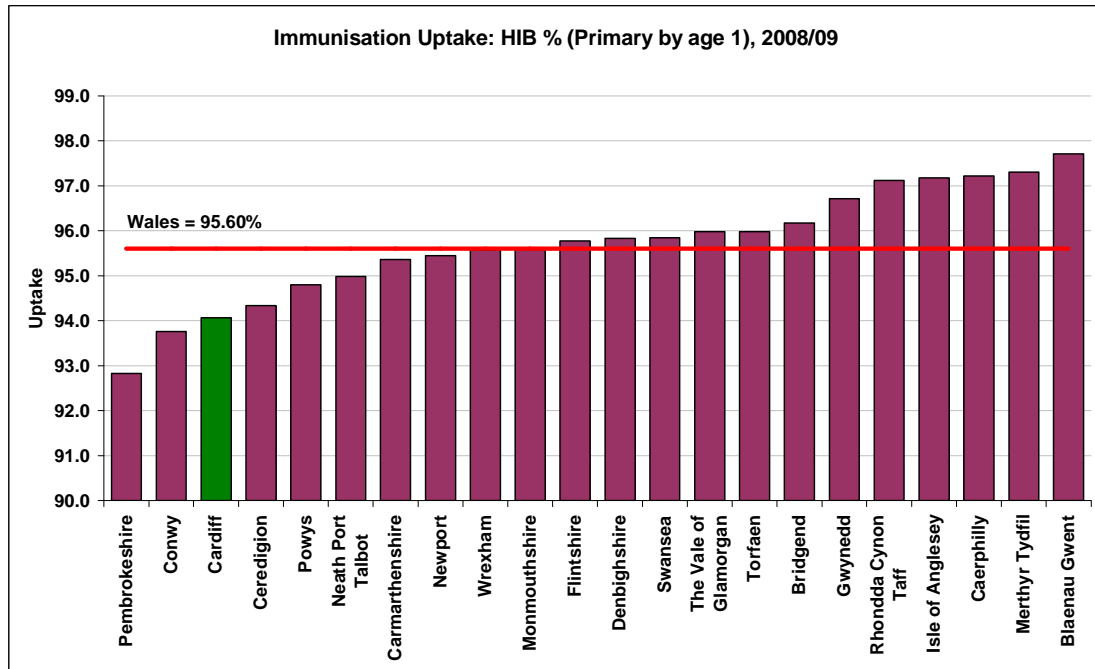
Since 2003/04, when it had the fourth lowest rate in Wales, Cardiff's diphtheria immunisation uptake rate has consistently been below the national average.

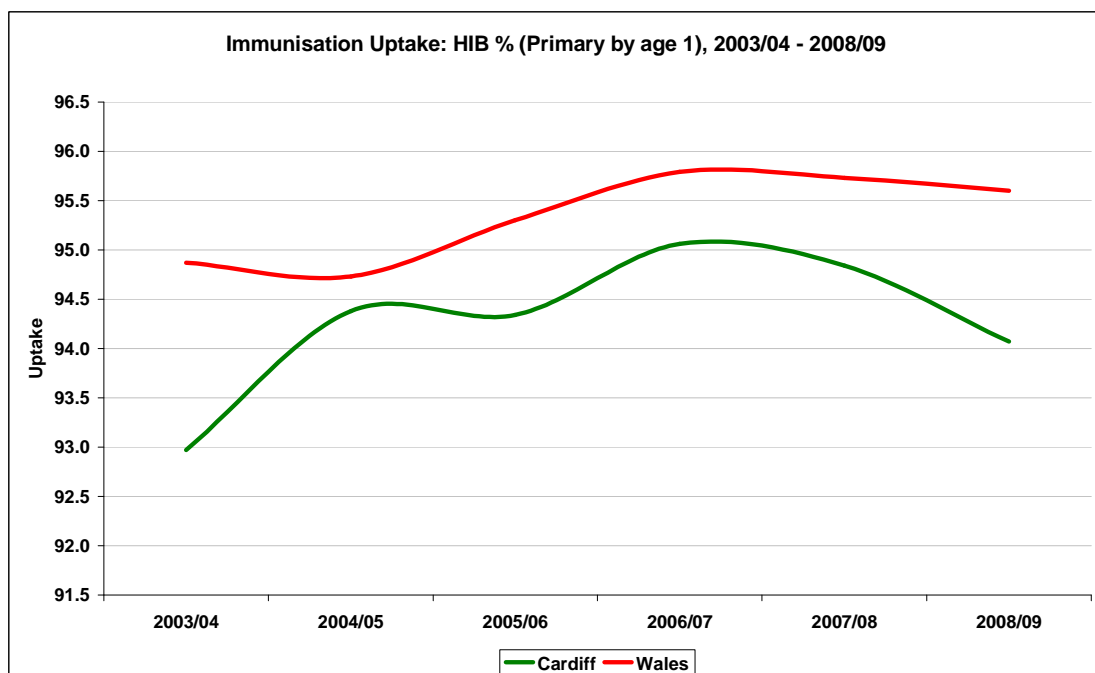
HIB

The immunisation uptake rate for HIB (primary vaccination by age 1) in Cardiff was 94.07% in 2008/09. This was the 3rd lowest rate in Wales and was also compared poorly with the national average of 95.60%.

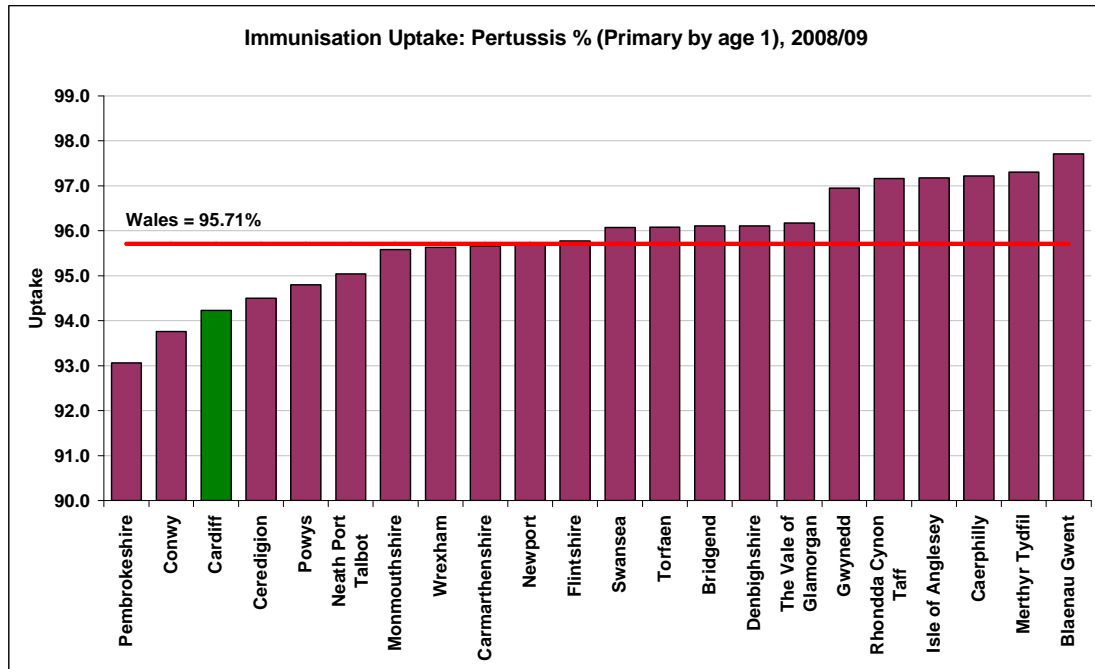
Since 2003/04, when it had the fourth lowest rate in Wales, Cardiff's HIB immunisation uptake rate has consistently been below the national average.

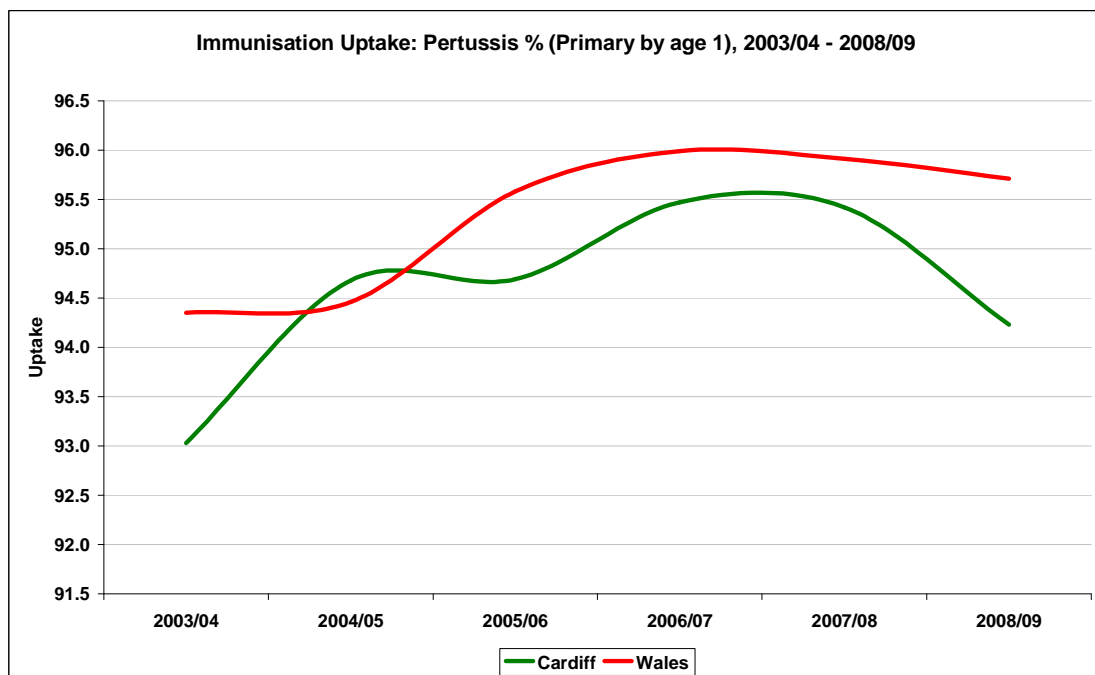
Pertussis

The immunisation uptake rate for pertussis (primary vaccination by age 1) in Cardiff was 94.23% in 2008/09. This was the 3rd lowest rate in Wales and was also below the national average of 95.71%.

Since 2003/04, when it had the fifth lowest rate in Wales, Cardiff's pertussis immunisation uptake rate has predominantly been below the national average despite rising above it in 2004/05.

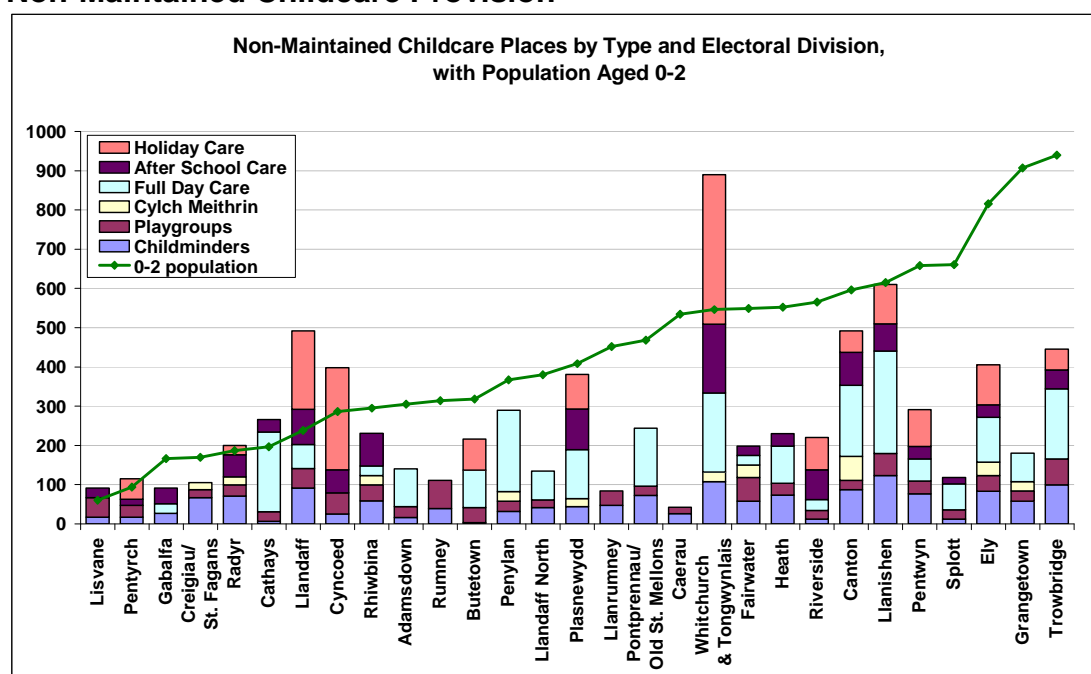

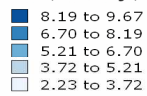

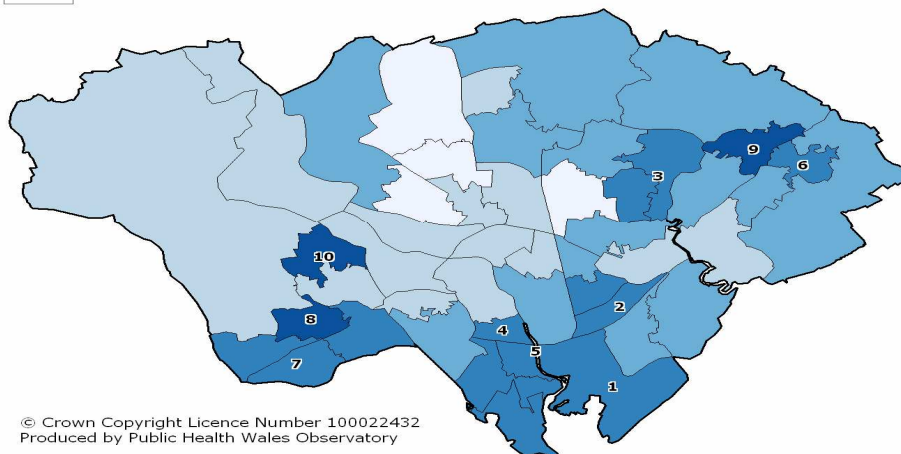
