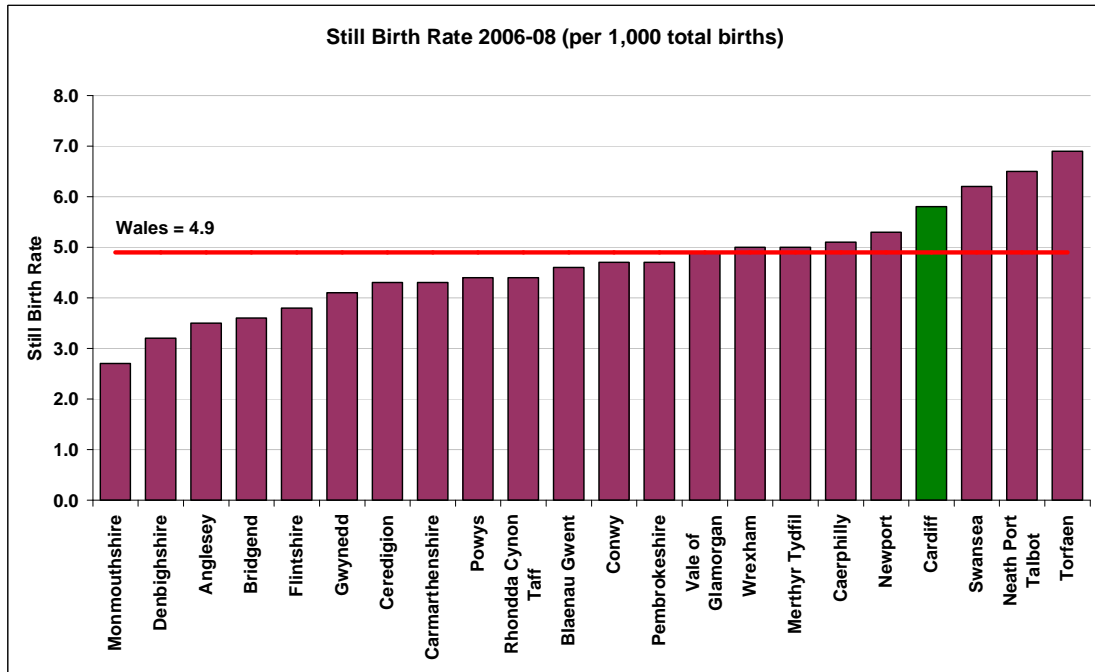


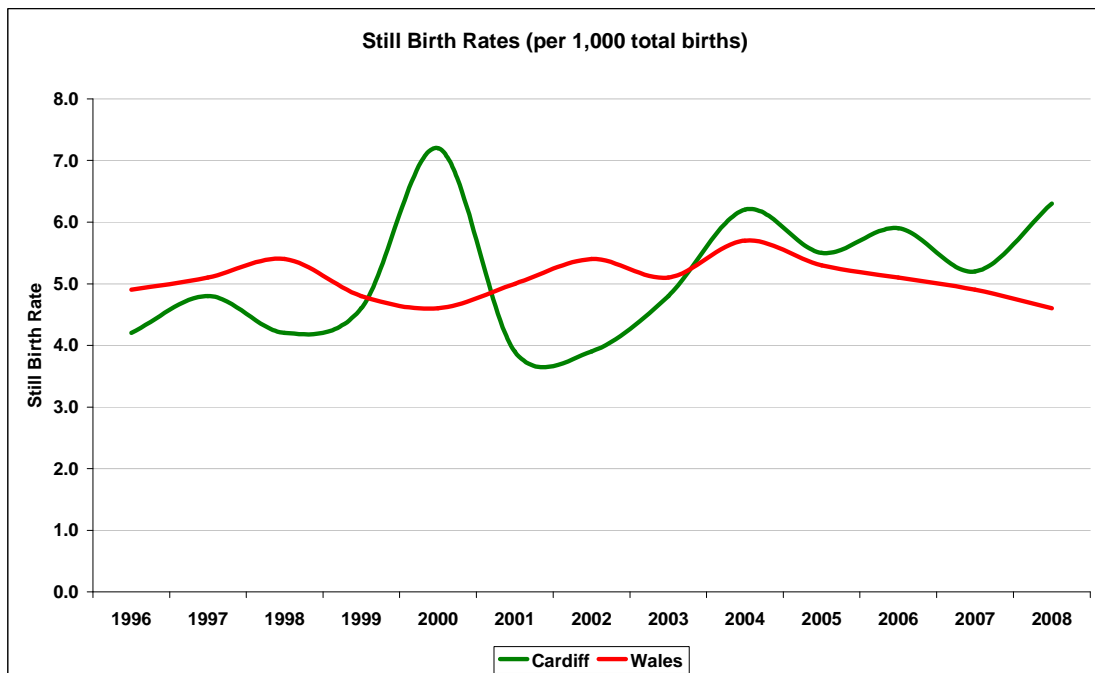
CORE AIM 3

Still Births

Cardiff averaged 5.8 still births per 1,000 total births between 2006 and 2008. This was the fourth highest rate in Wales and above the national average of 4.9.

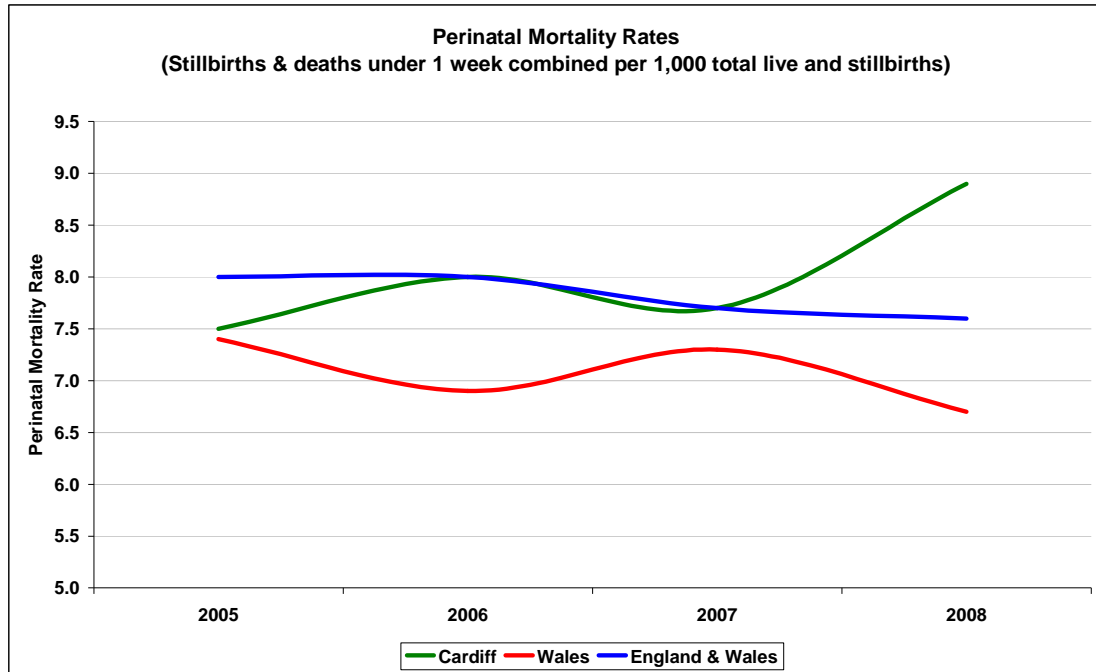

Between 1996 and 2003 Cardiff's still birth rate was predominantly below the Welsh average. However, since 2004 it has exceeded the national rate.

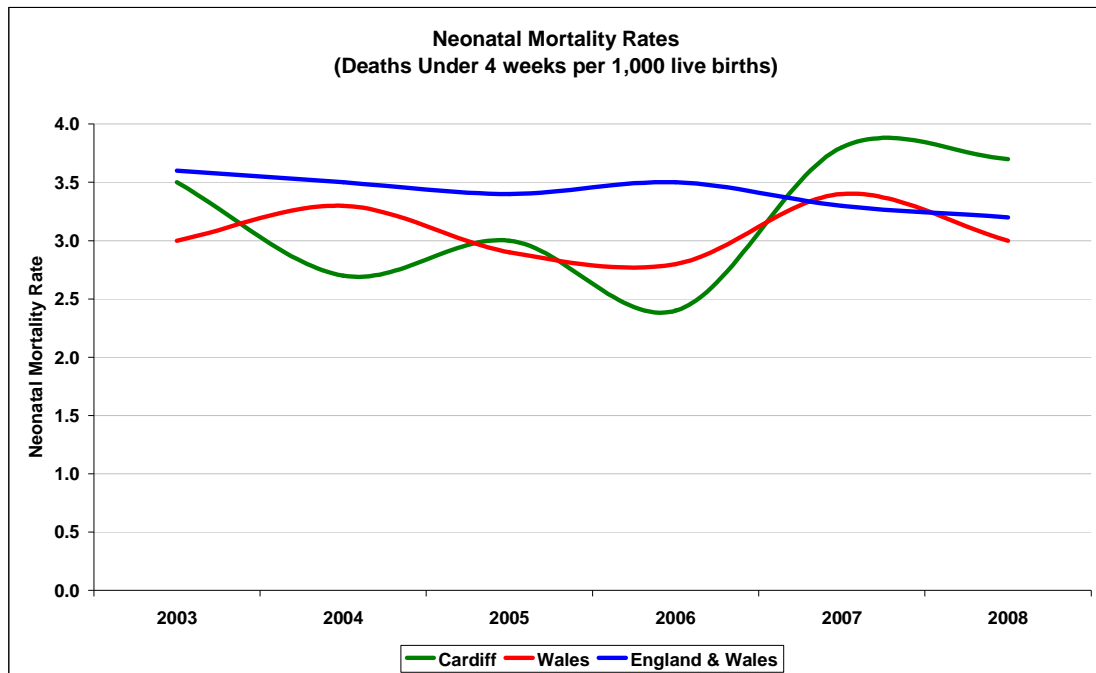
Perinatal Mortality

In 2008 Cardiff's perinatal mortality rate was 8.9 per 1,000 total live and stillbirths and had increased from 7.5 in 2005. Since 2005 Cardiff's rate had exceeded that of Wales and in 2008 was also above the figure for England & Wales.

Neonatal Mortality

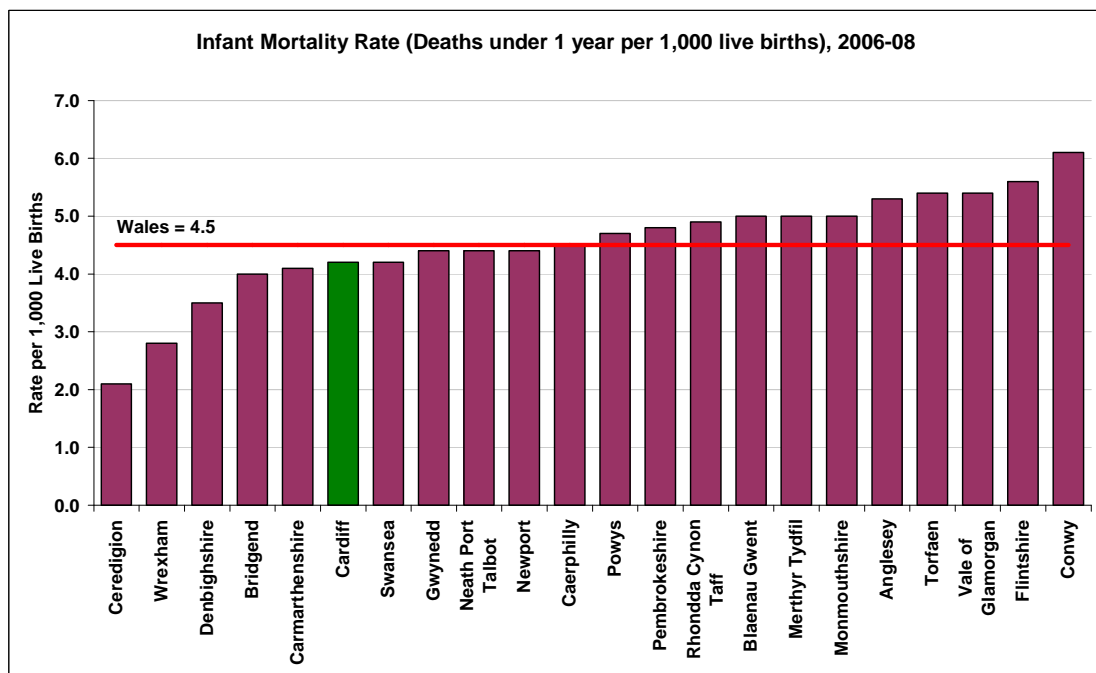

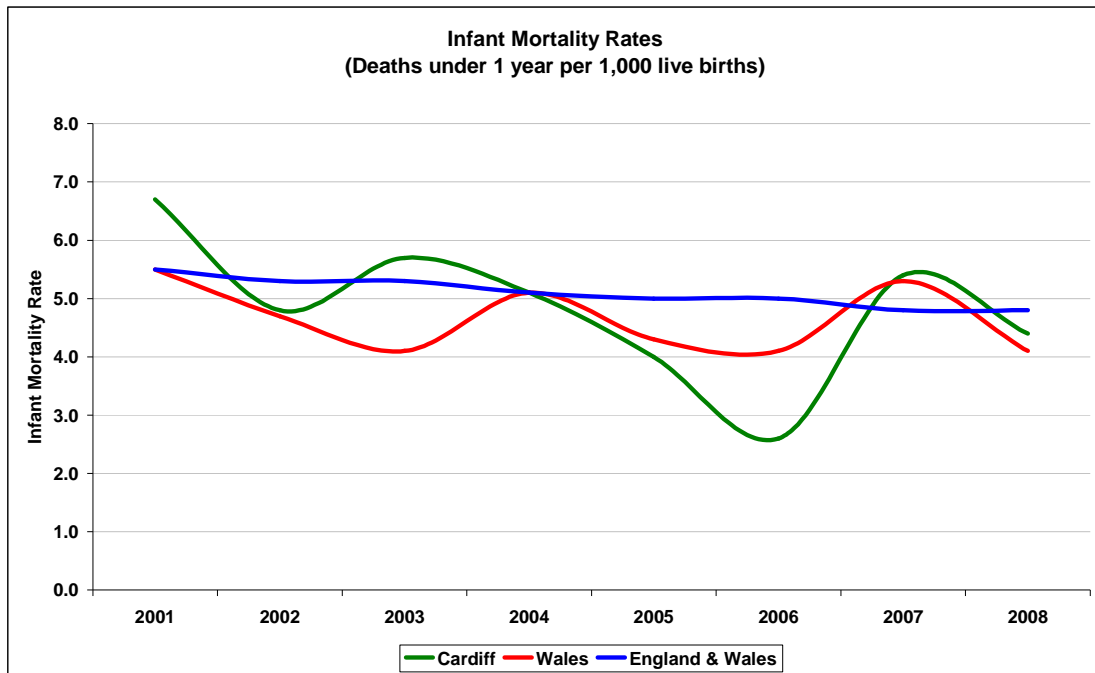
In 2008 Cardiff's neonatal mortality rate was 3.7 per 1,000 live births. It had increased from 3.5 in 2003 despite following a downward trend until 2006. Between 2003 and 2006 Cardiff's rate fluctuated around the Welsh average and was consistently below the England & Wales figure. However, after this time the local authority rate exceeded those seen in both of the larger regions.

For the period of 2006 to 2008 Cardiff's infant mortality rate was 4.2 per 1,000 live births. This was the sixth lowest in Wales and was below the national average of 4.5.



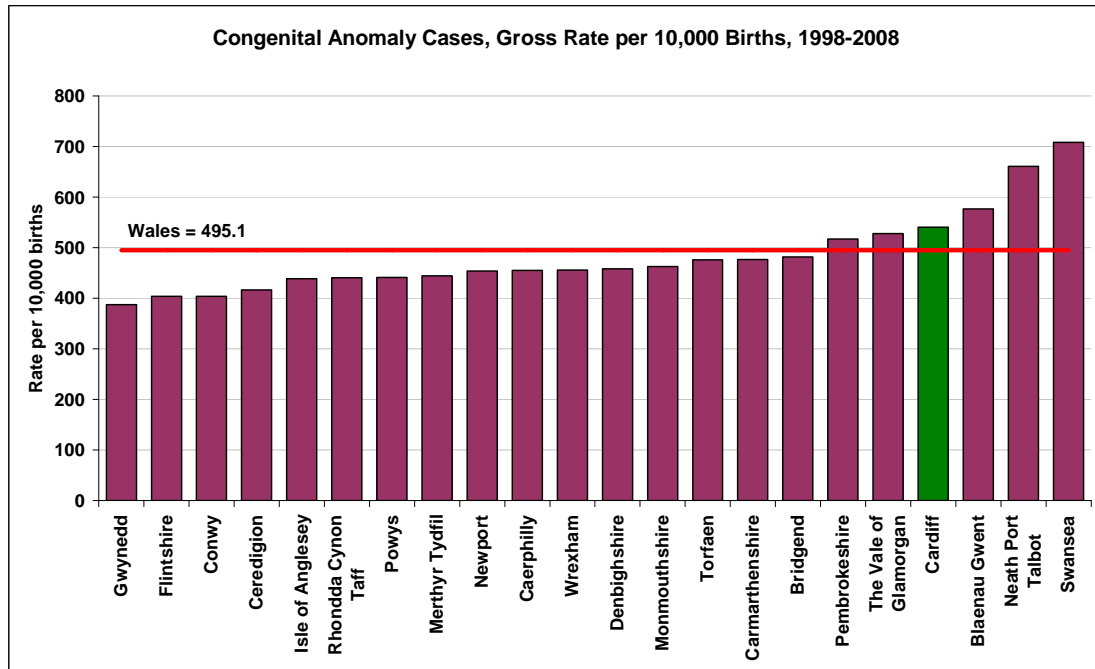

Cardiff's infant mortality rate decreased from 6.7 per 1,000 live births in 2001 to 4.4 in 2008. Over the period the local authority rate fluctuated around those of Wales and England & Wales but in 2008 was above the Welsh rate and below the figure for England & Wales.

Congenital Anomalies

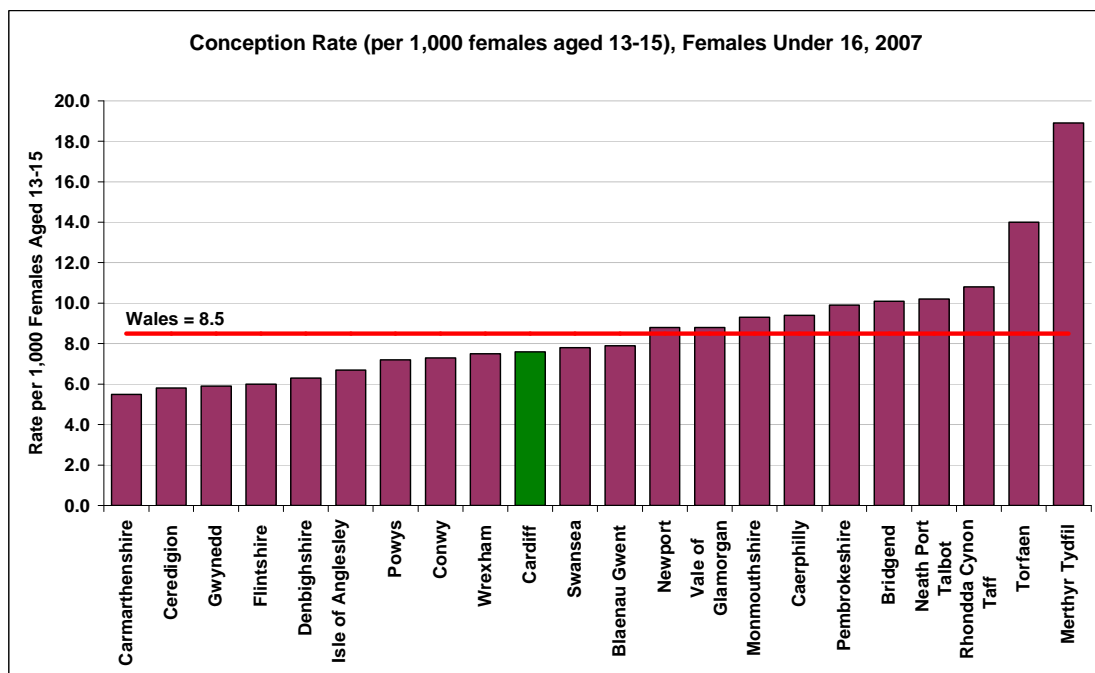
For the period of 1998 to 2008 Cardiff had the fourth highest rate of congenital anomaly cases in Wales with 540.8 per 10,000 births. This exceeded the national average of 495.1.

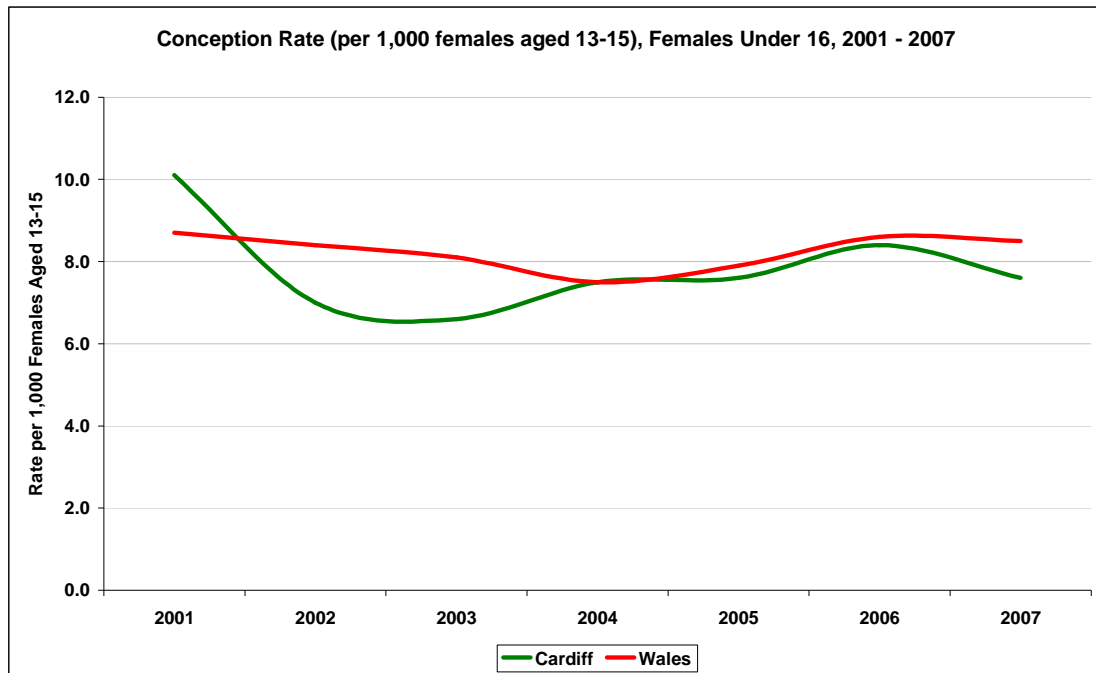

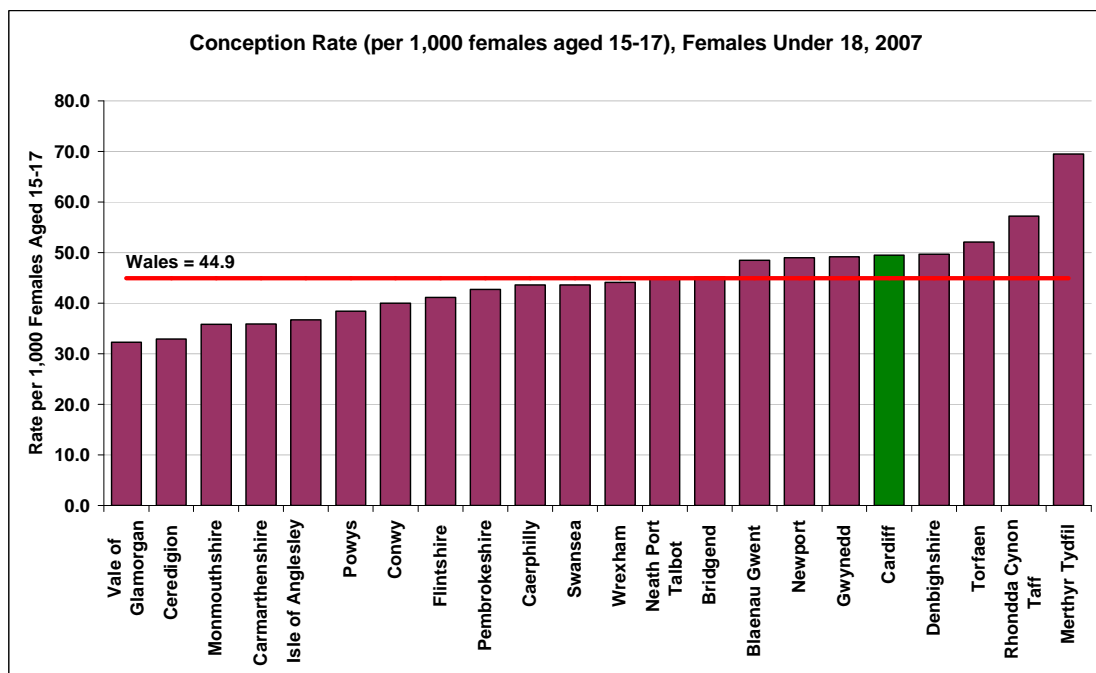
In 2007 Cardiff had a conception rate for females aged under 16 of 7.6 per 1,000 females aged 13 to 15. This was the tenth lowest rate in Wales and was below the national average of 8.5.

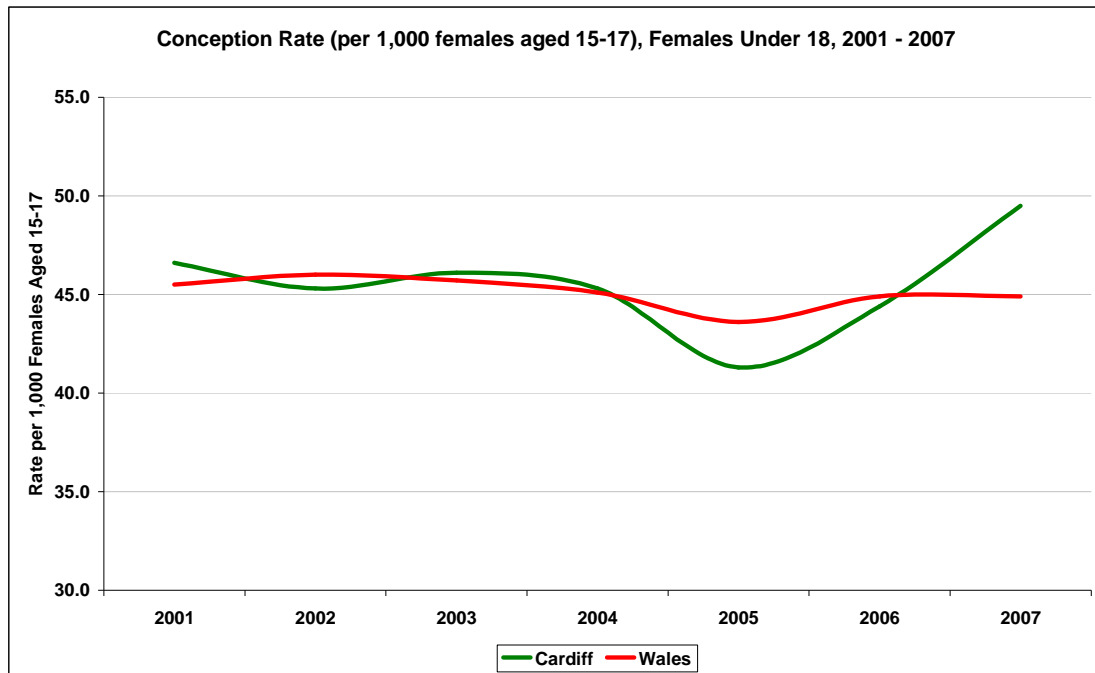
In 2001 Cardiff had the sixth highest rate in Wales and exceeded the national average. However, since then it has predominantly been below the Welsh rate.

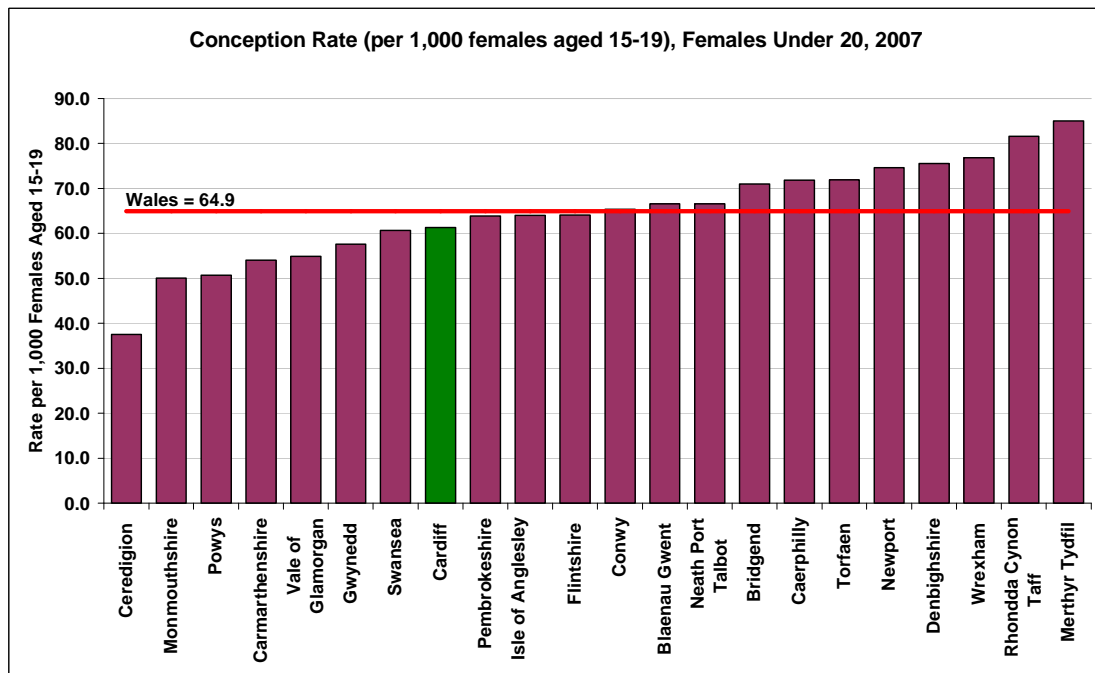

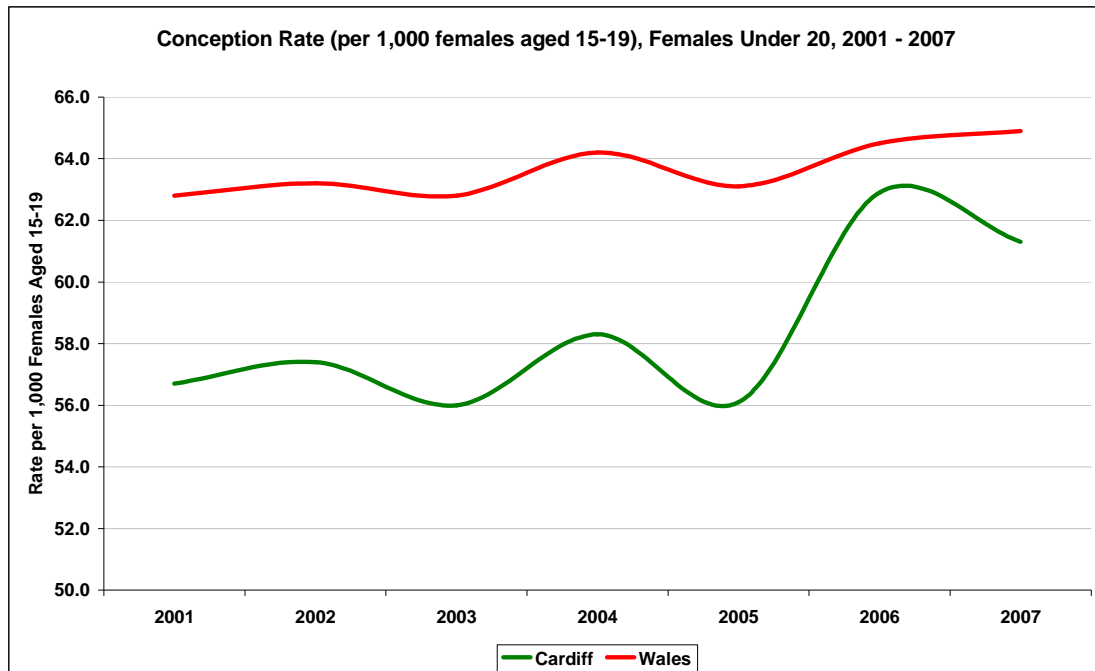

In 2007 Cardiff's conception rate for females aged under 20 was 61.3 per 1,000 females aged 15 to 19. This was the eighth lowest rate in Wales and below the national average of 64.9.

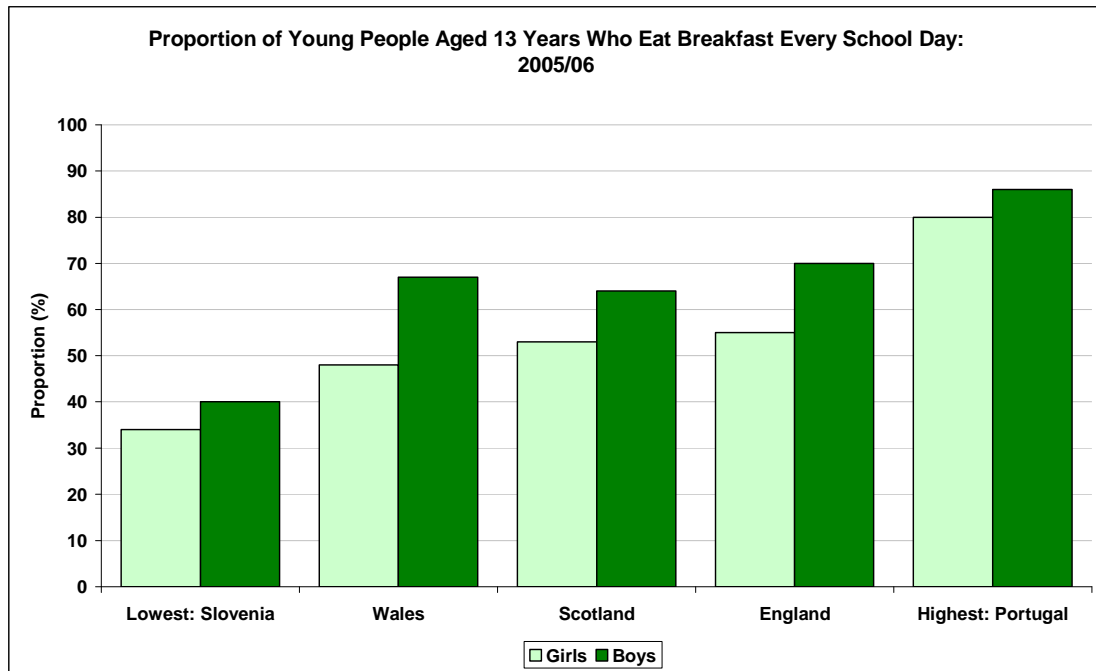
Cardiff's rate has generally followed an upward trend since 2001 when it had the ninth lowest rate in Wales. However, it has consistently been below the national average during the period.

Nutrition & Obesity

In Wales more boys (67%) aged 13 years eat breakfast every school day than girls (48%).

The proportion for boys in Wales exceeds that seen in Scotland but is below the England percentage.

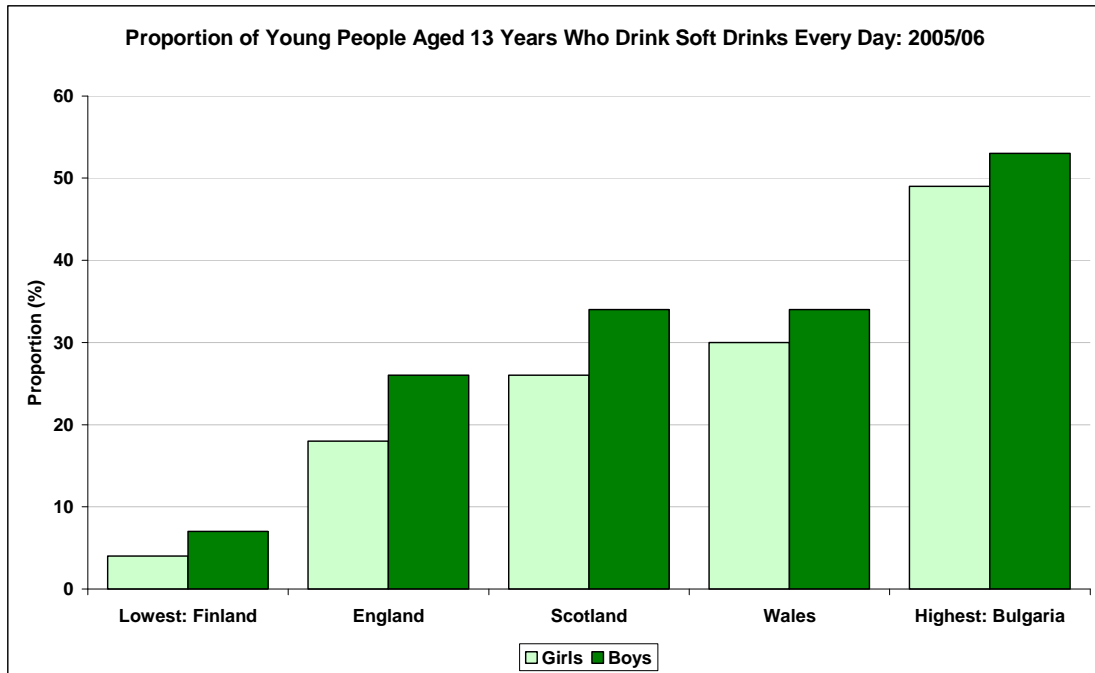

The proportion for girls in Wales exceeds the equivalent figures for both Scotland and England.

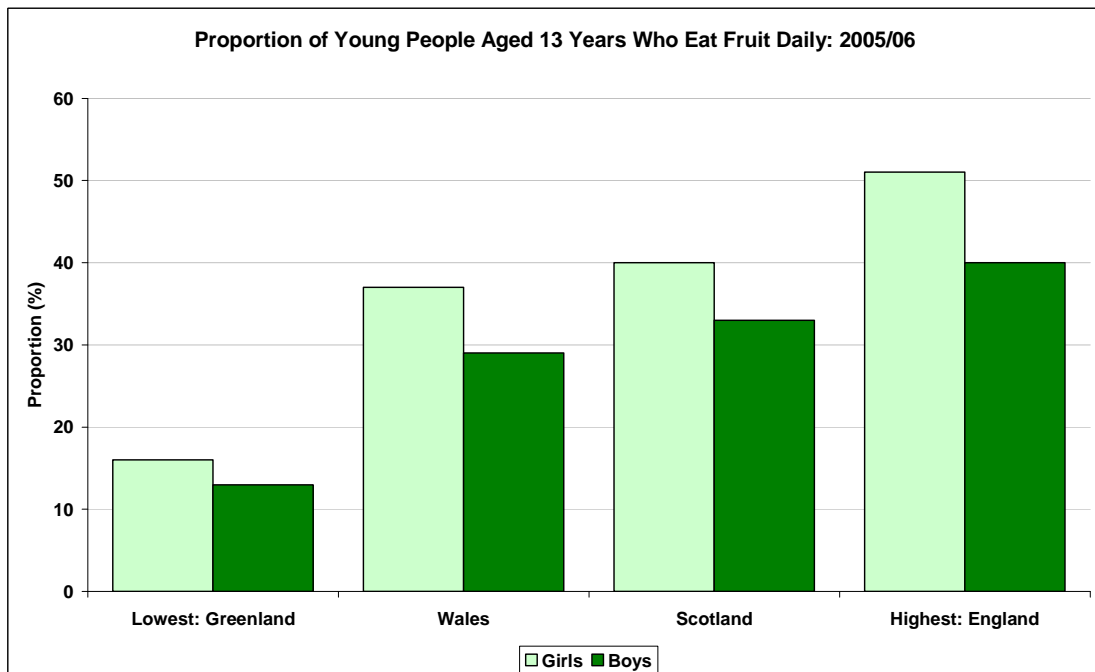

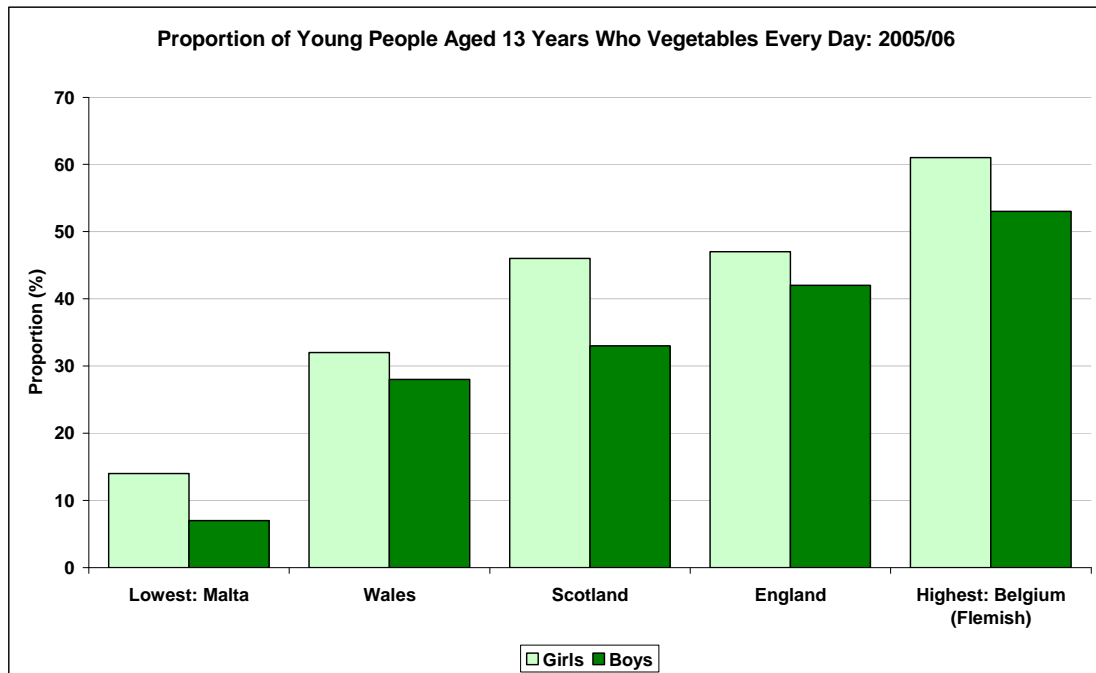

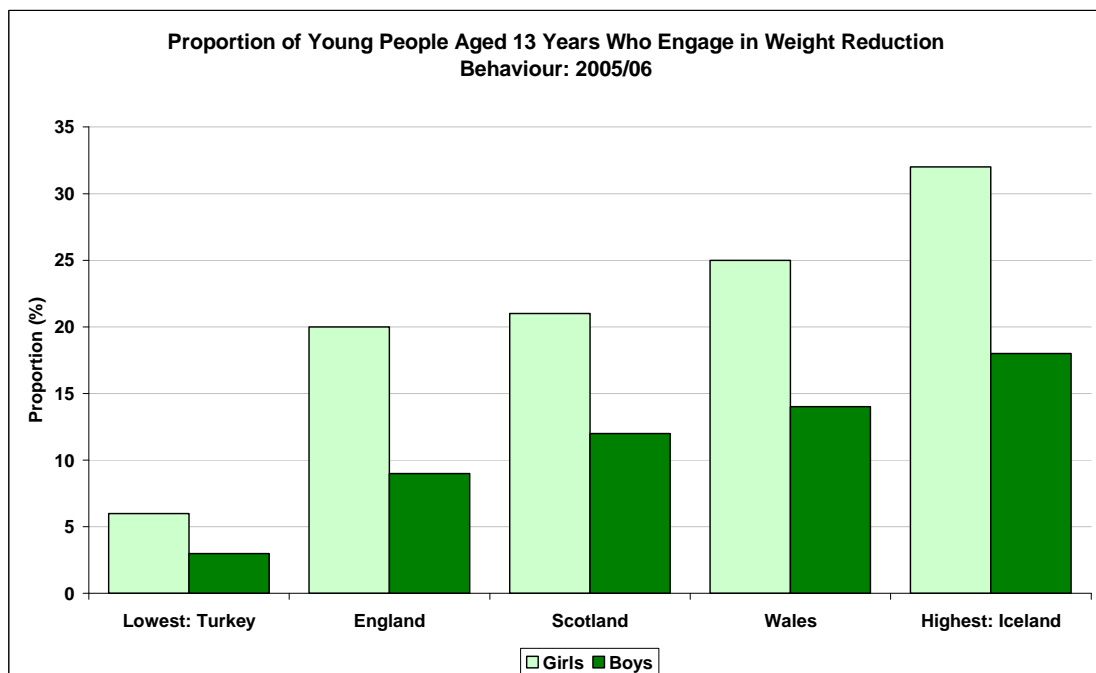

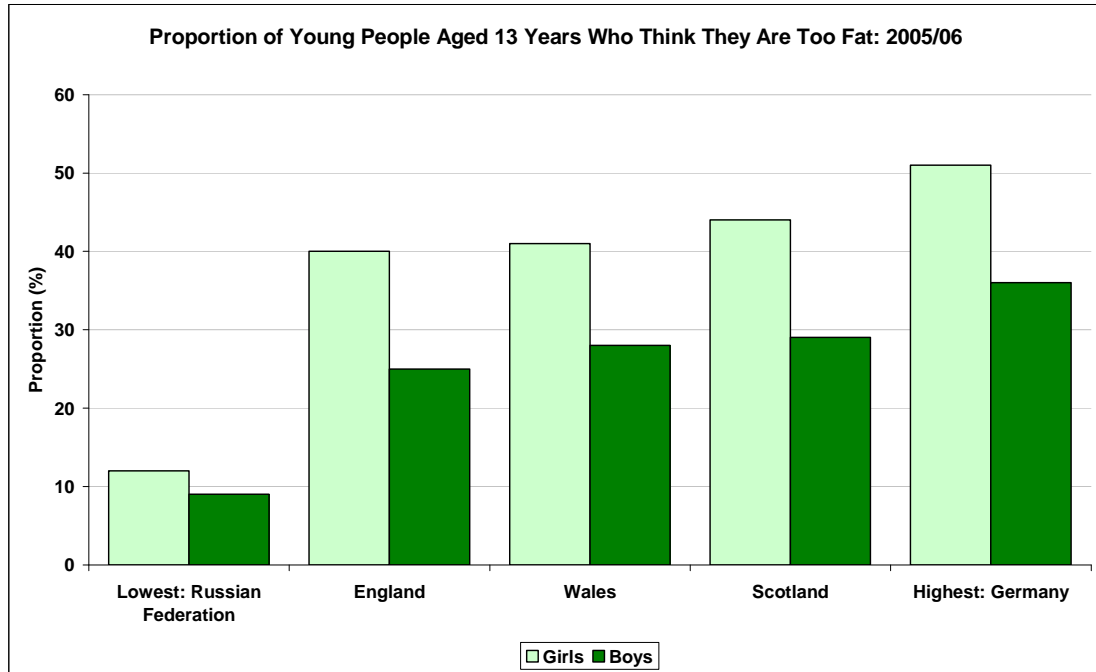

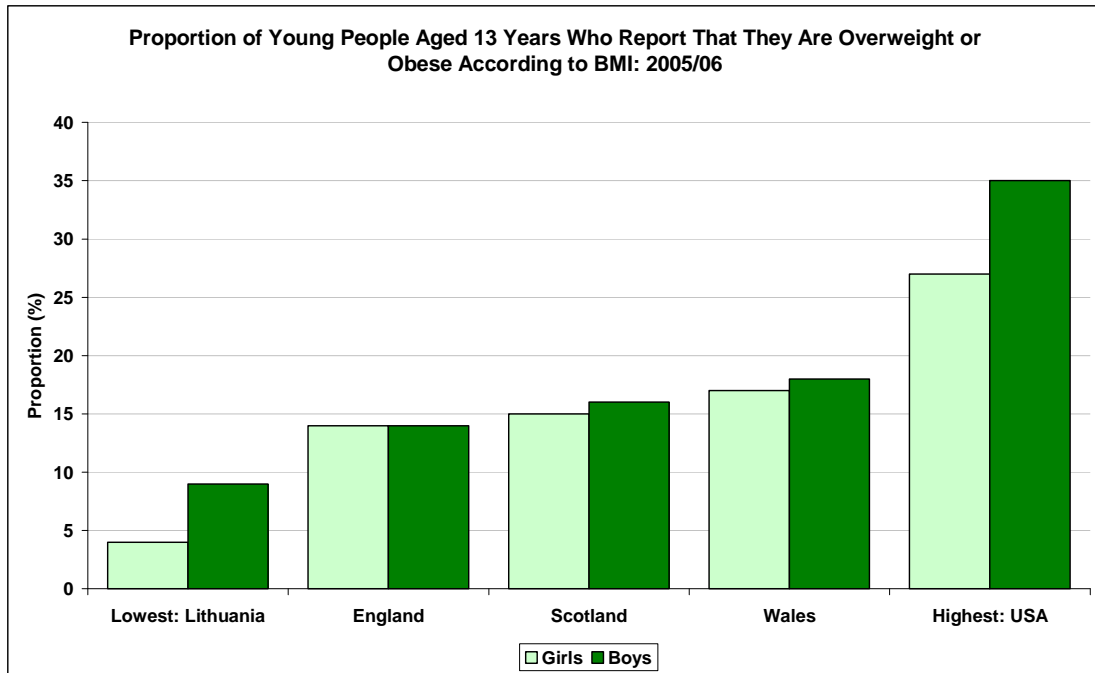

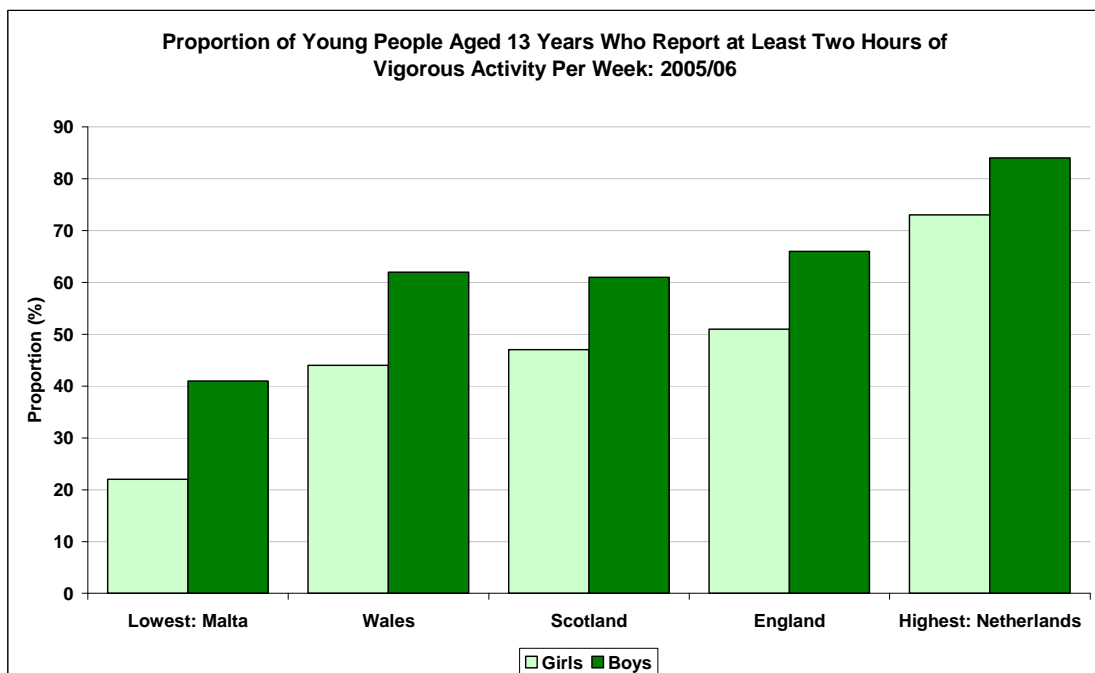

The proportion for boys in Wales exceeds that seen in Scotland but is below the England percentage.



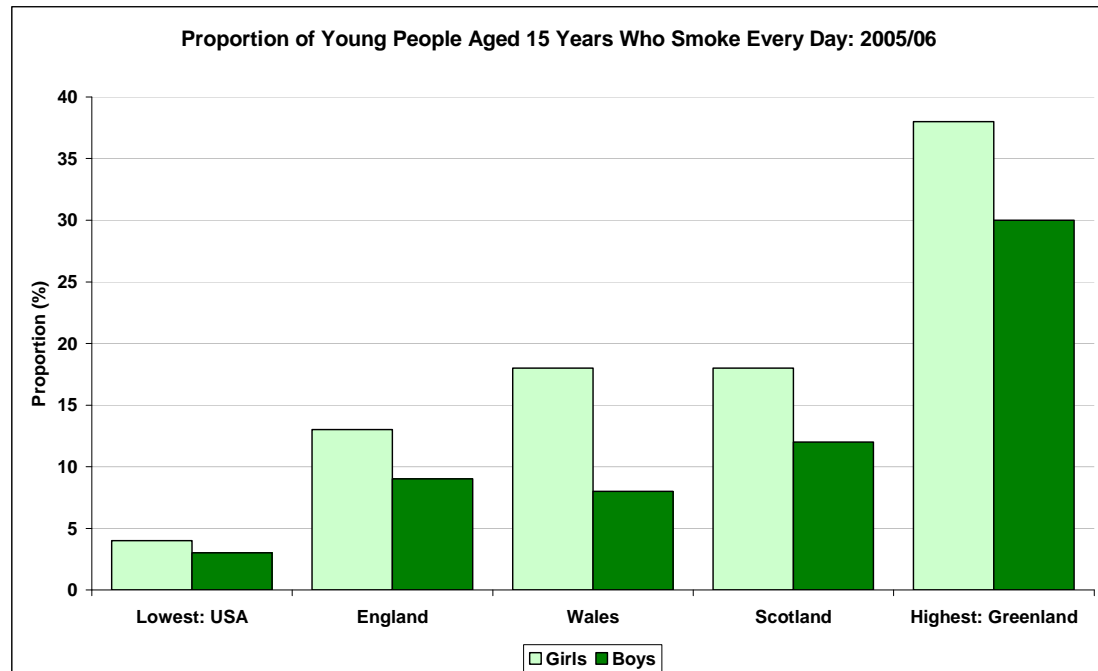

The proportion for boys in Wales is below the equivalent figures for both Scotland and England.



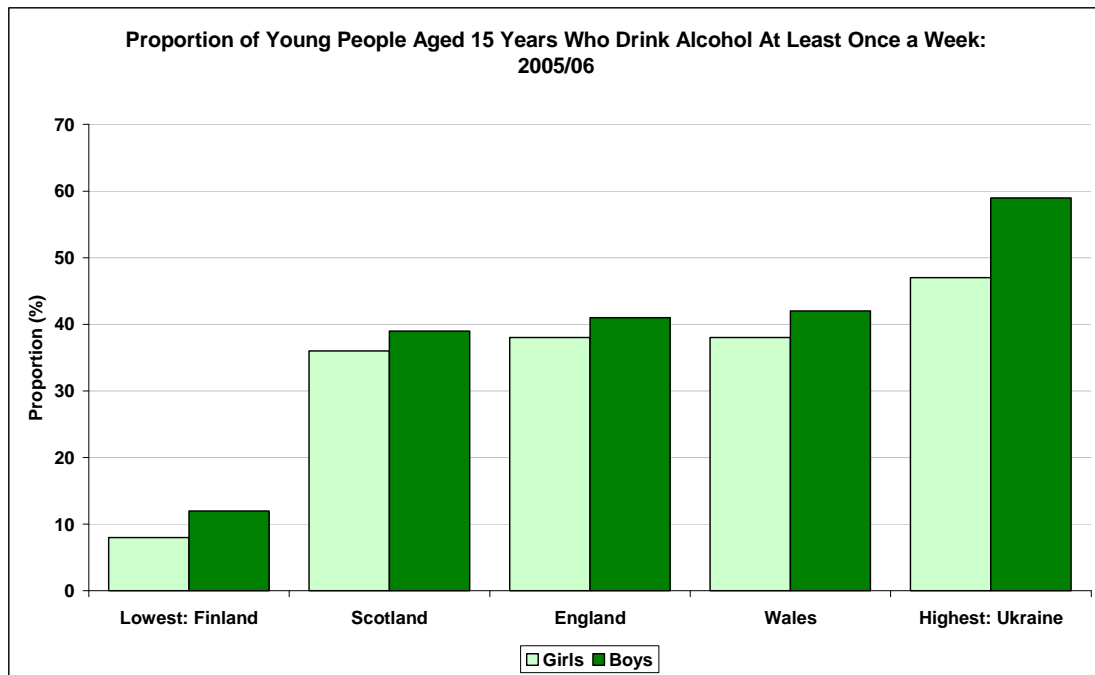

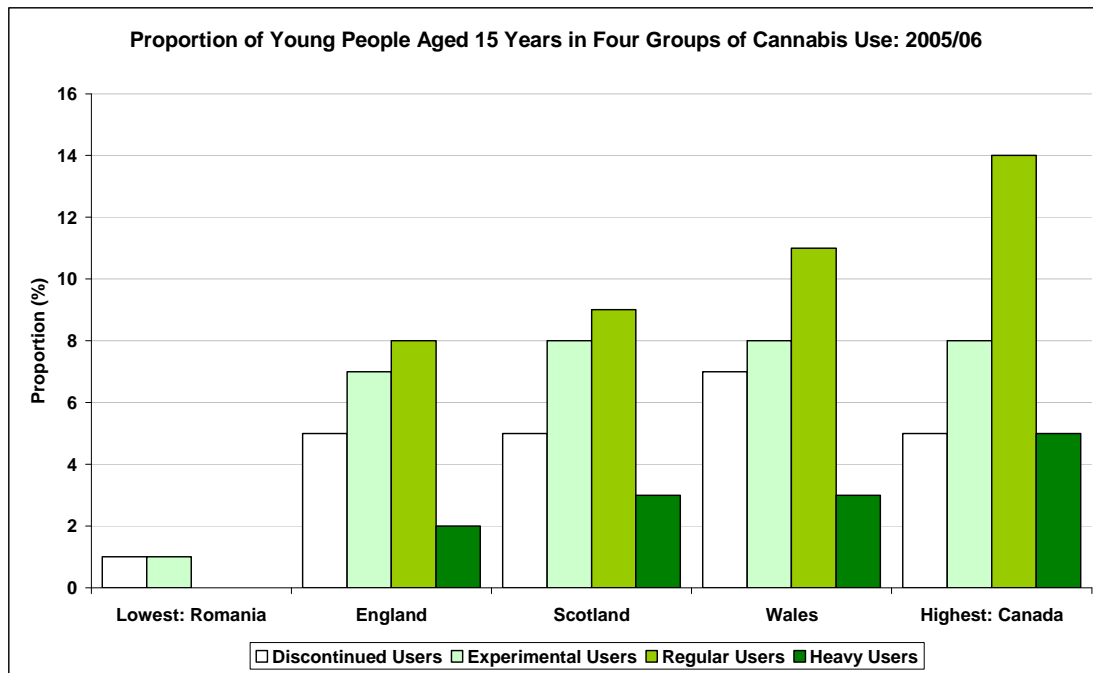
Cannabis

In Wales 3% of young people aged 15 years are heavy cannabis users. This exceeds the figure for England and is the same as that for Scotland.

In Wales 11% of young people aged 15 years are regular cannabis users. This exceeds the figures for both England and Scotland.

In Wales 8% of young people aged 15 years are experimental cannabis users. This exceeds the figure for England and is the same as that for Scotland.

In Wales 7% of young people aged 15 years are discontinued cannabis users. This exceeds the figures for both England and Scotland.

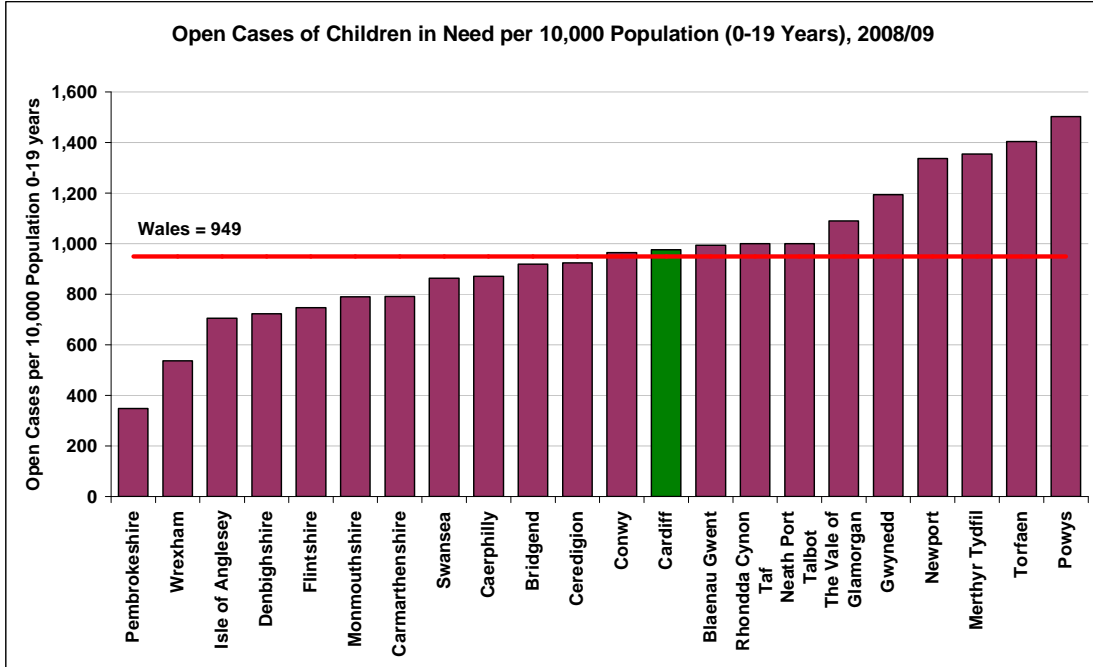

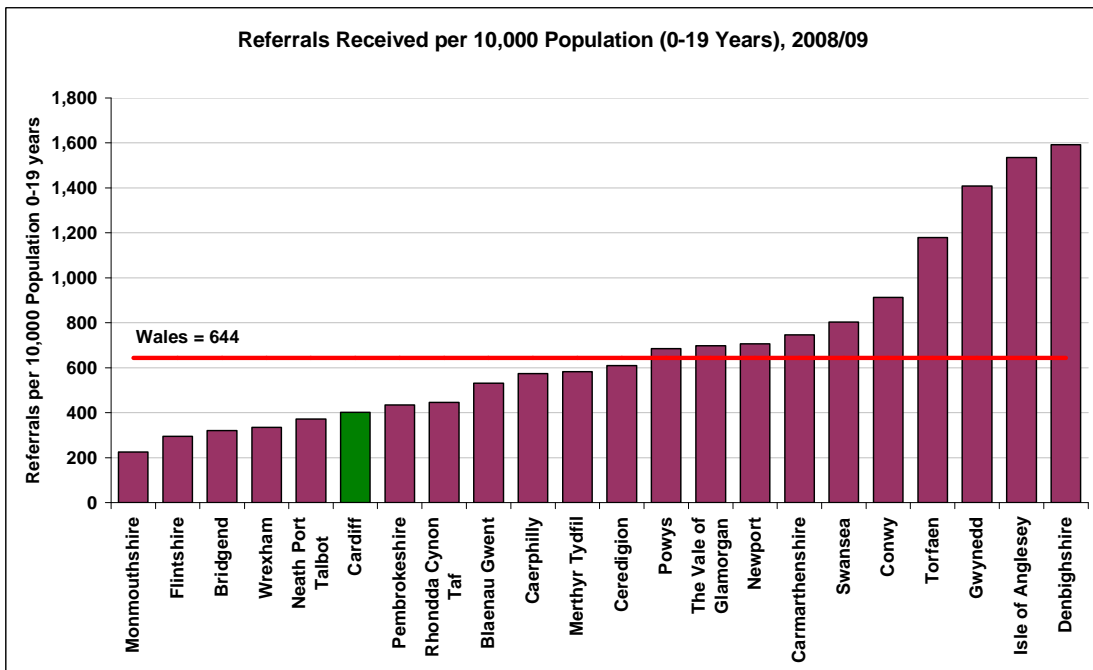
Children in Need

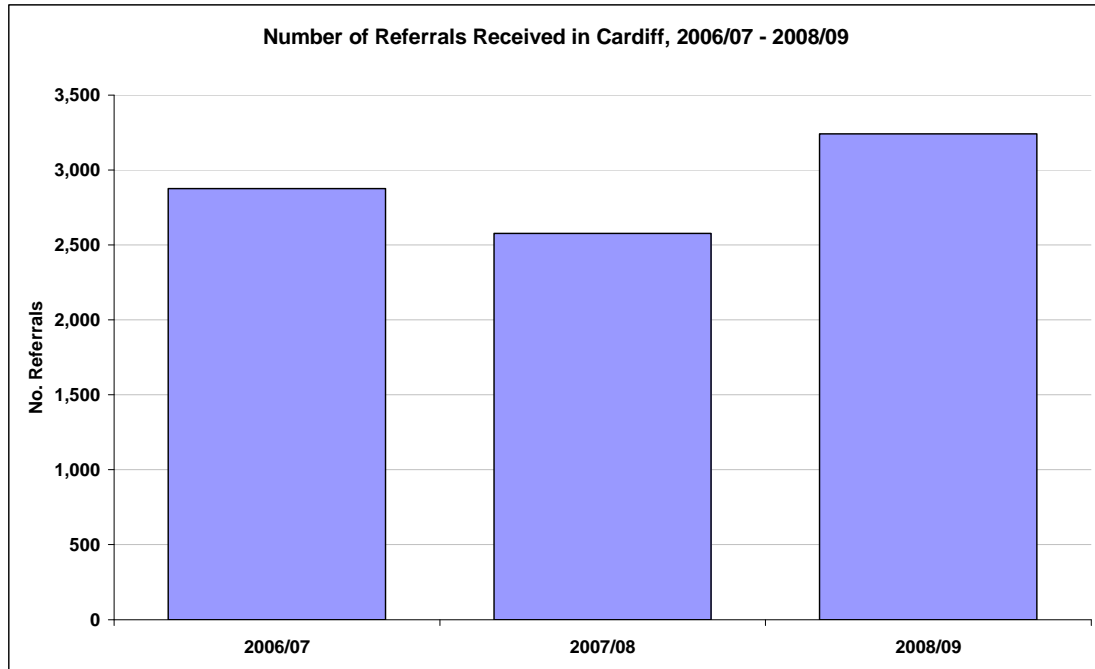

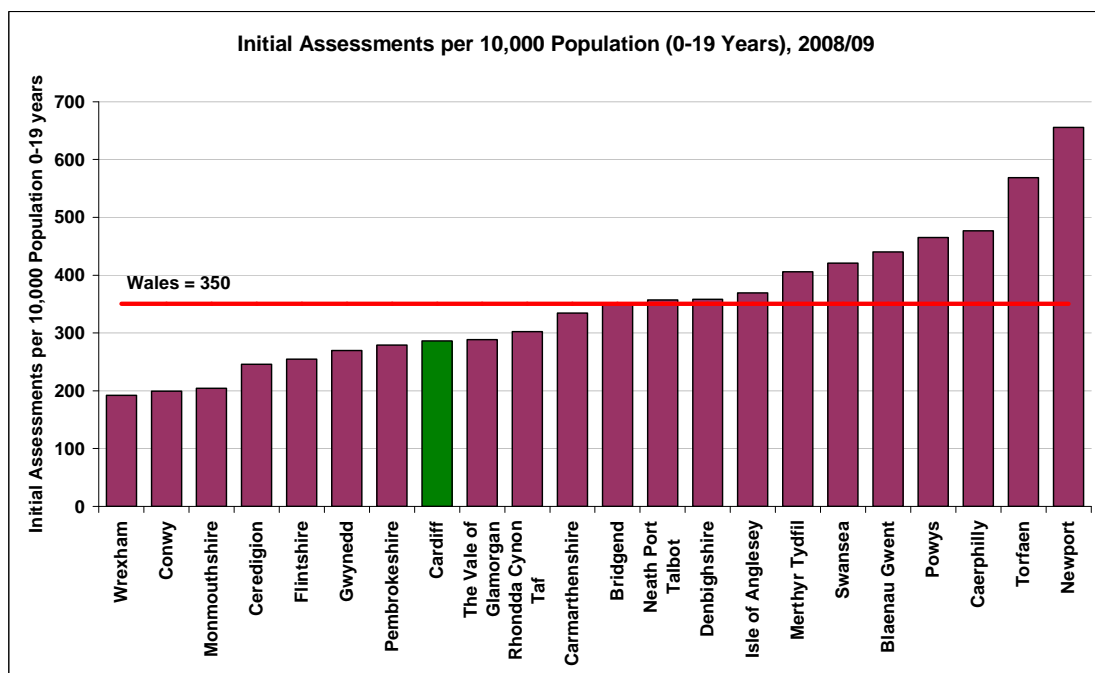

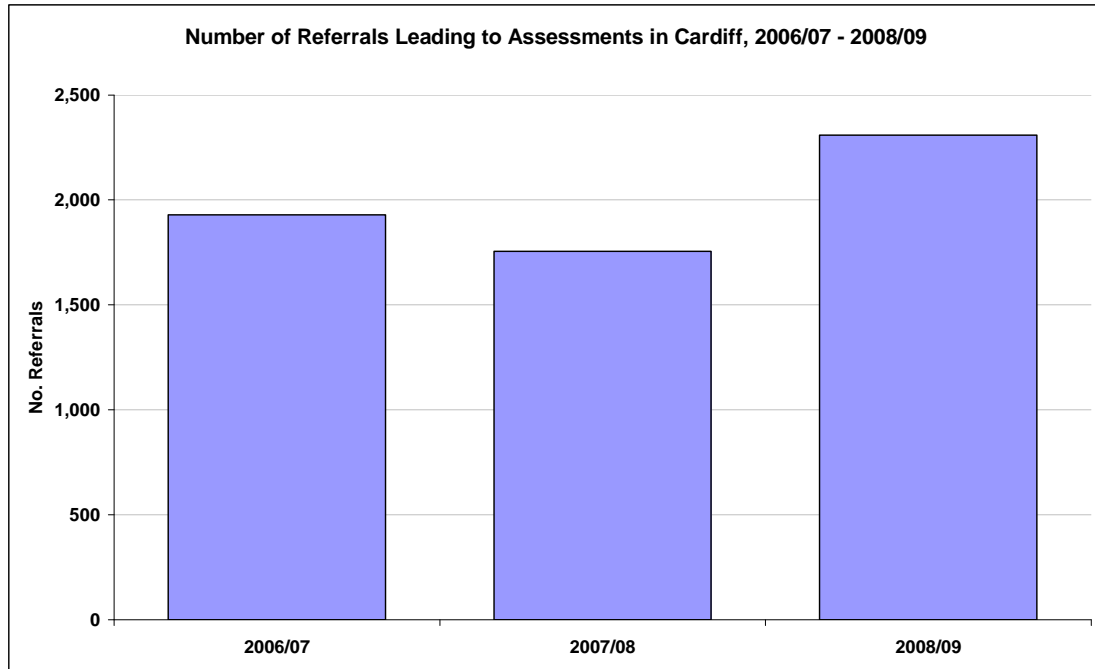
Since 2006/07 the number of referrals received in Cardiff has increased by 12.7% despite a decrease between 2006/07 and 2007/08.

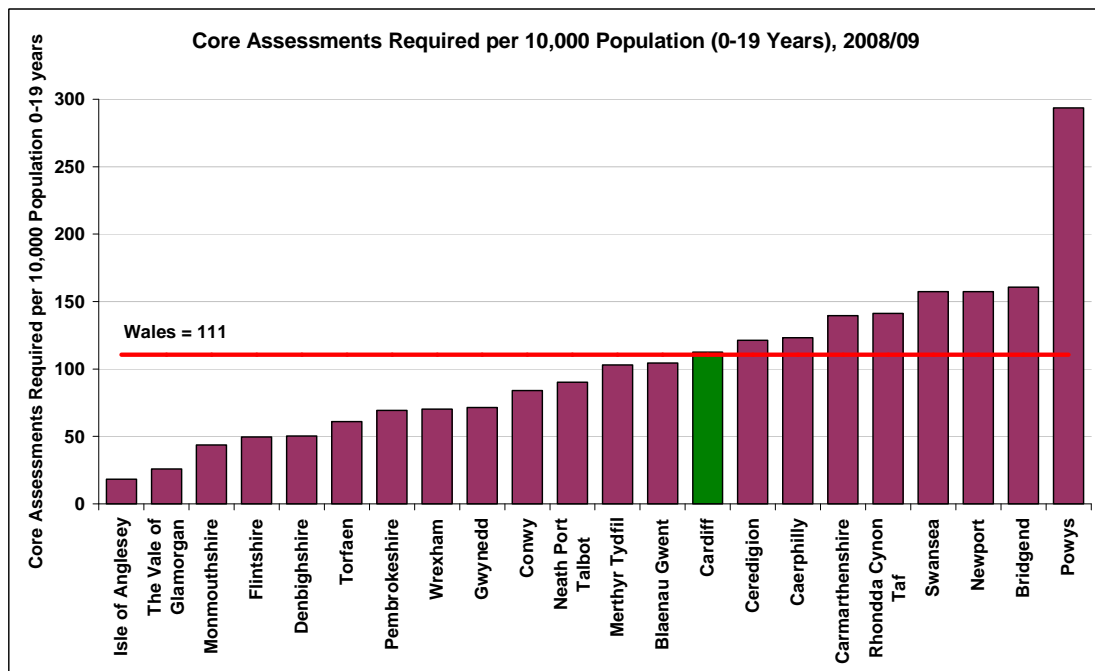

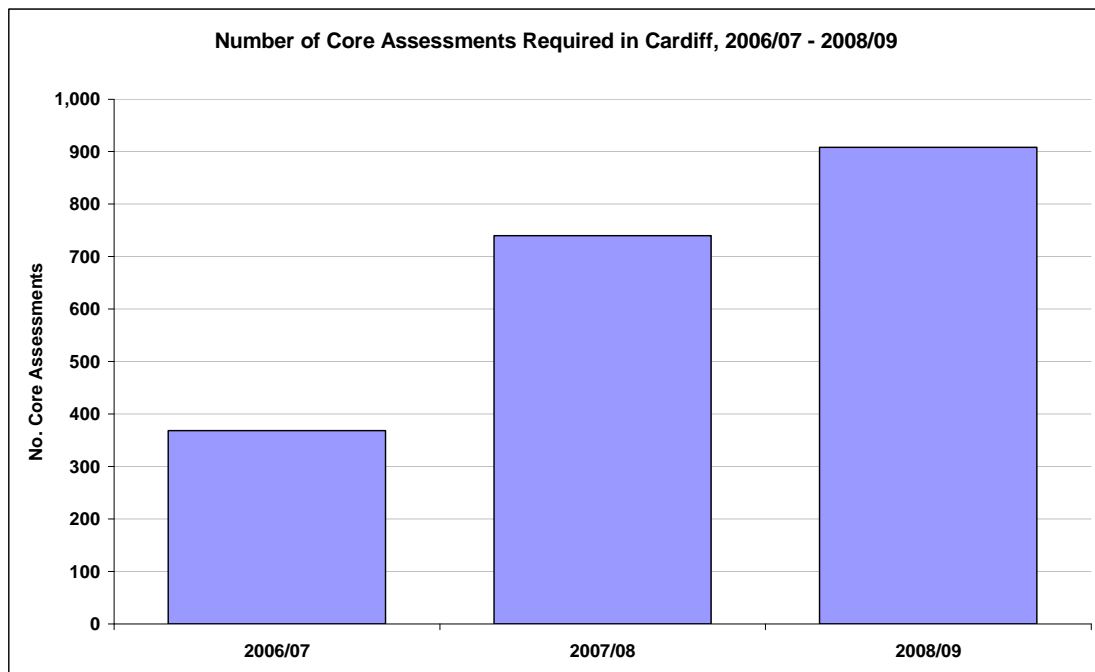

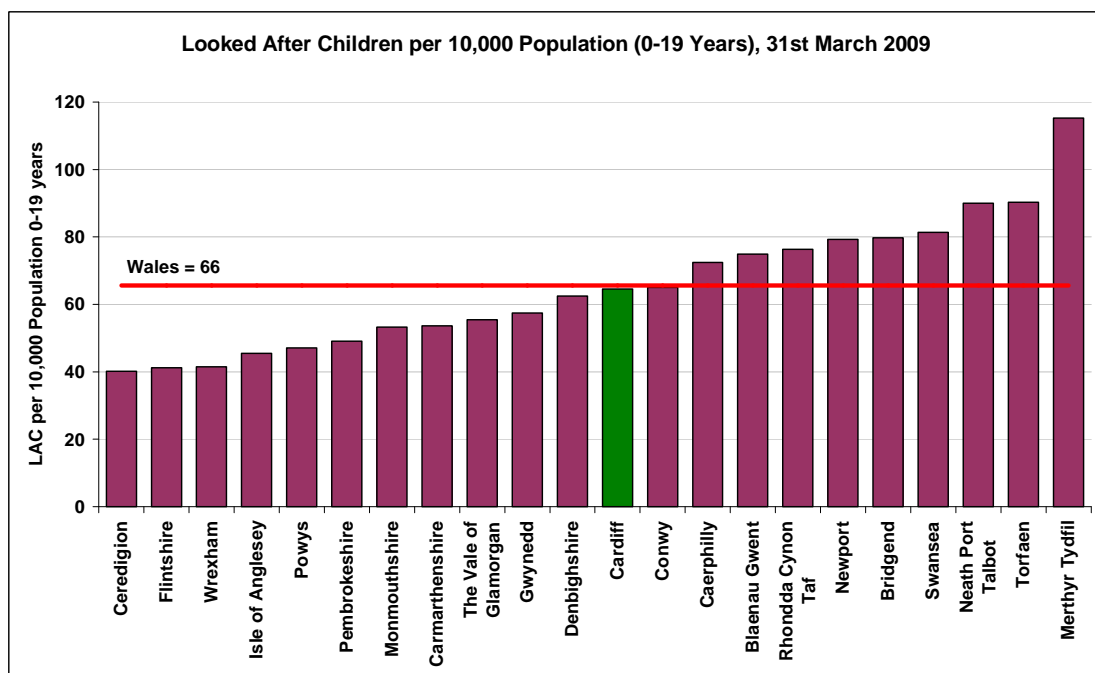

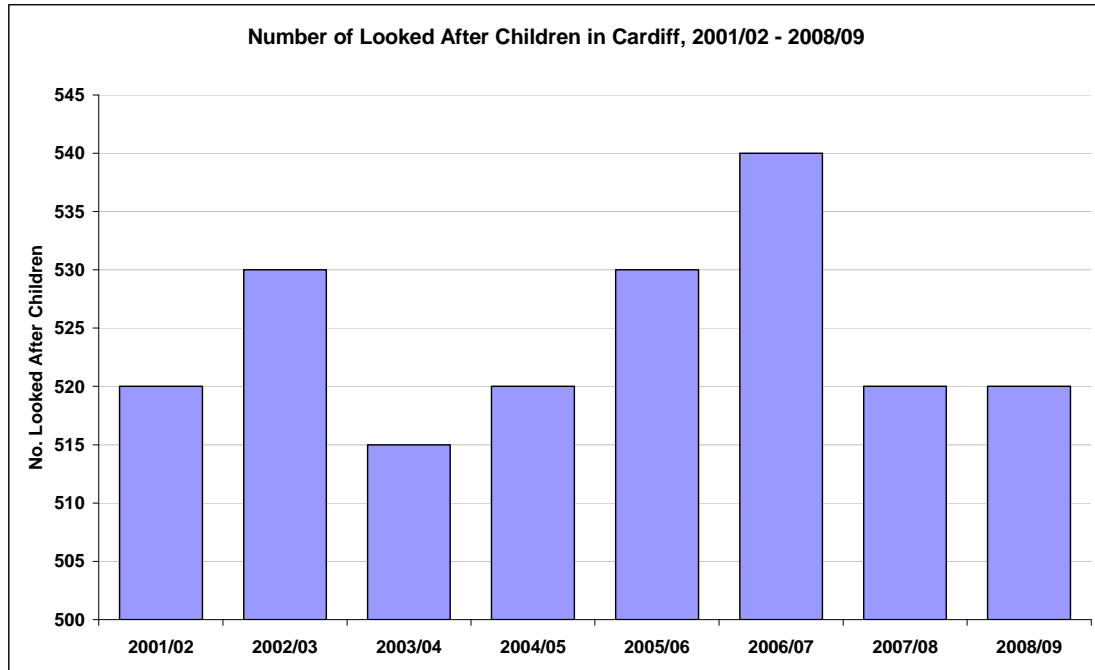

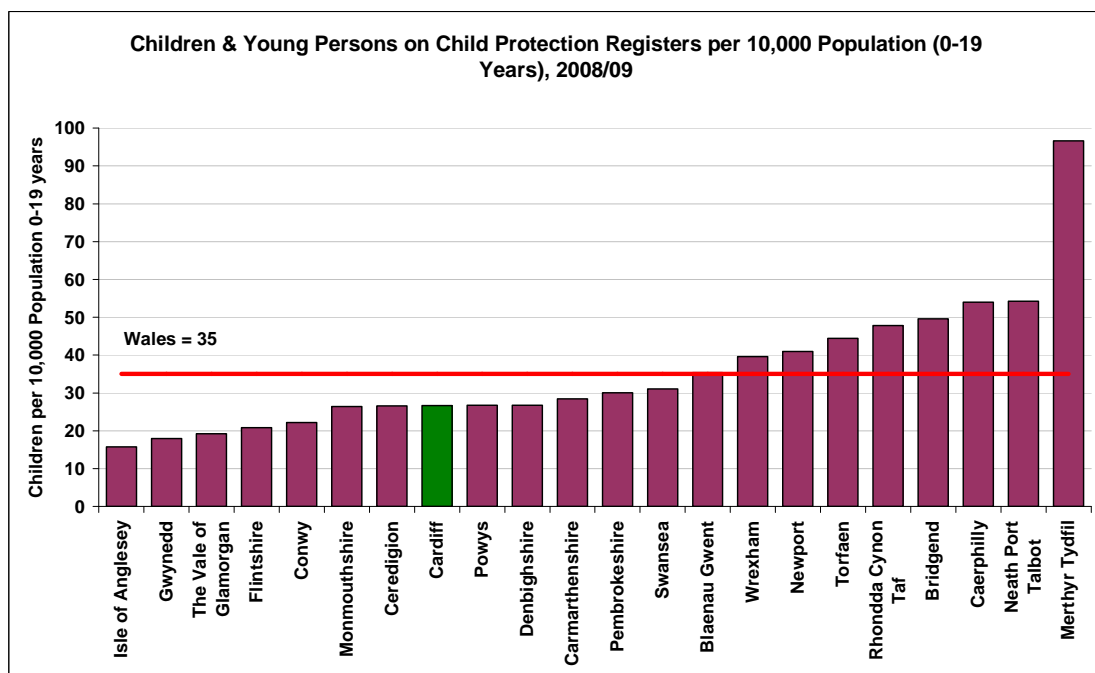

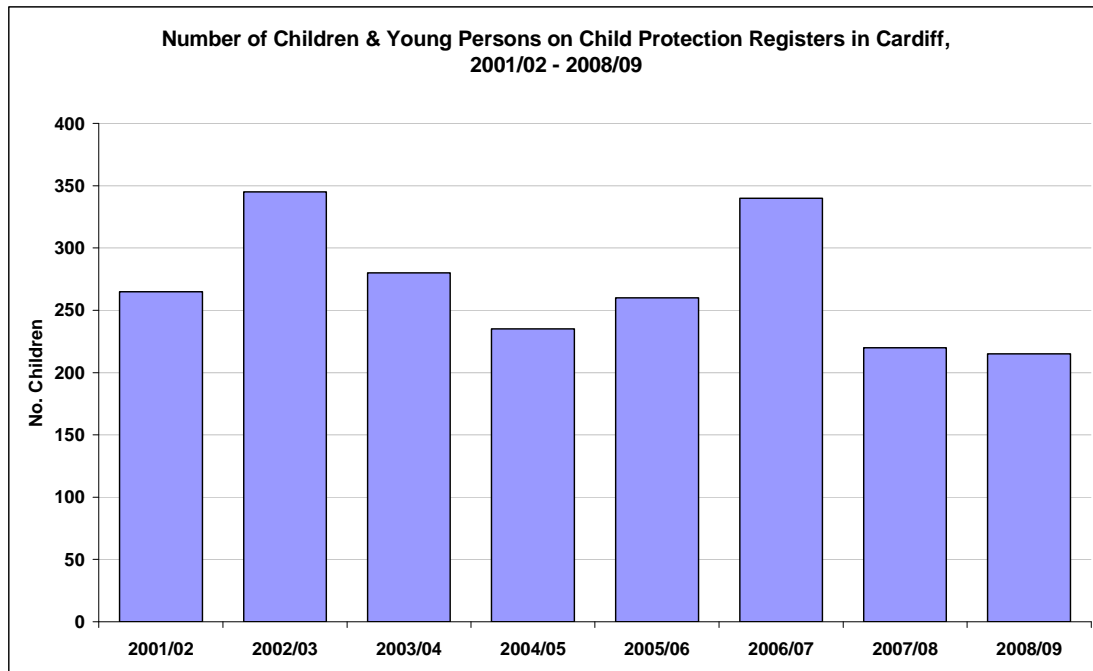

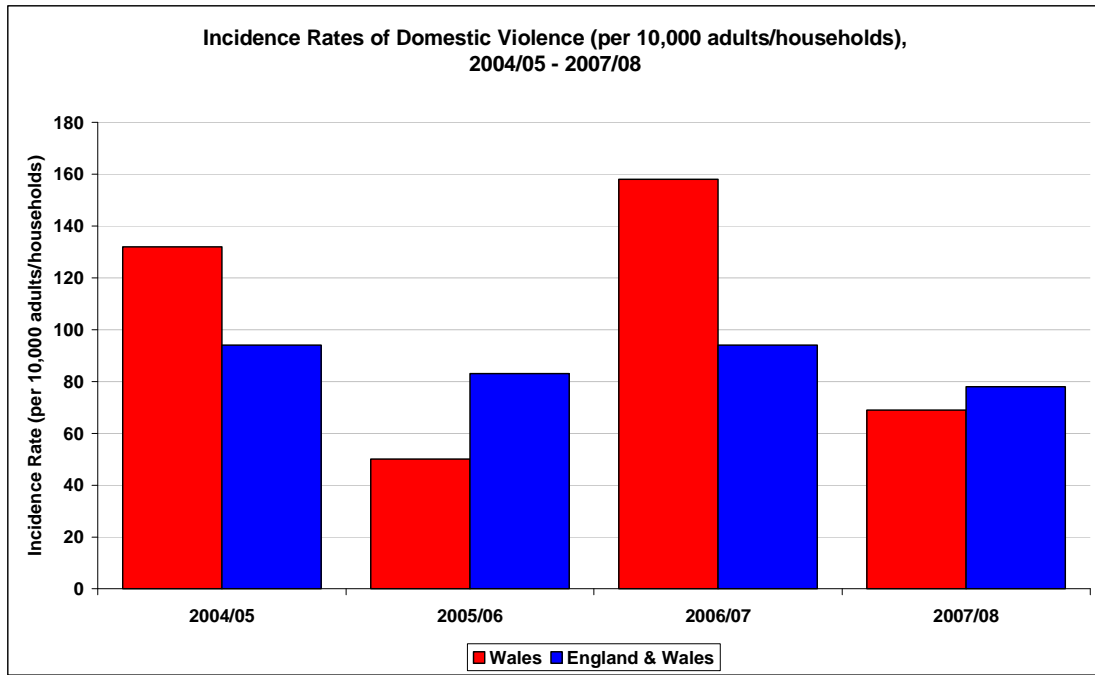

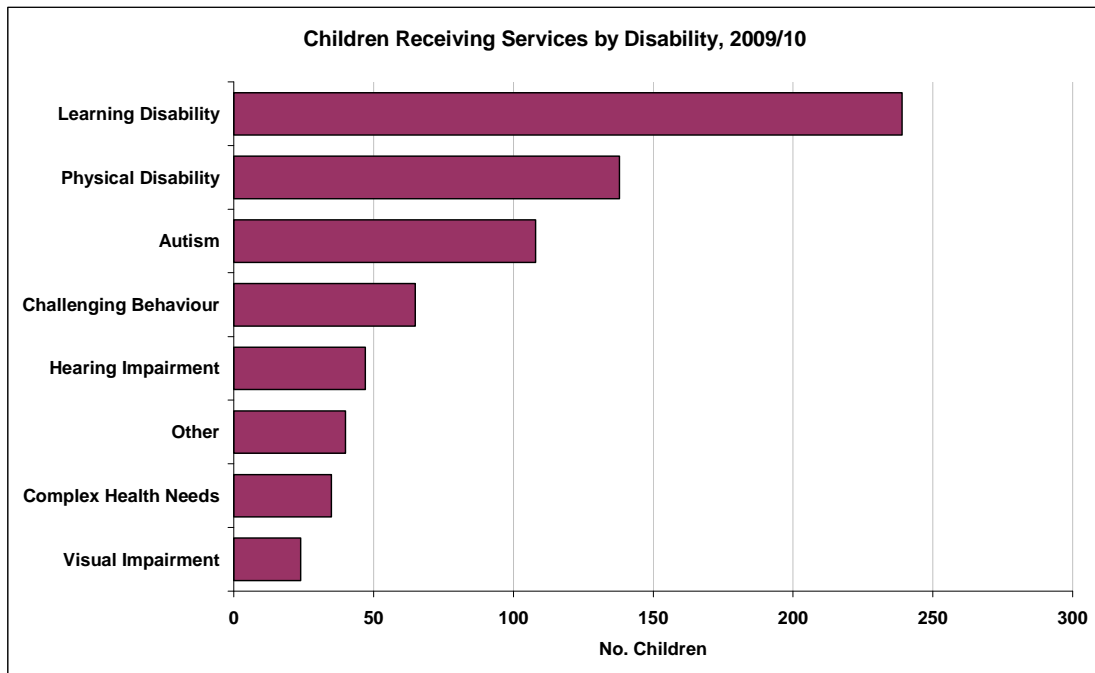

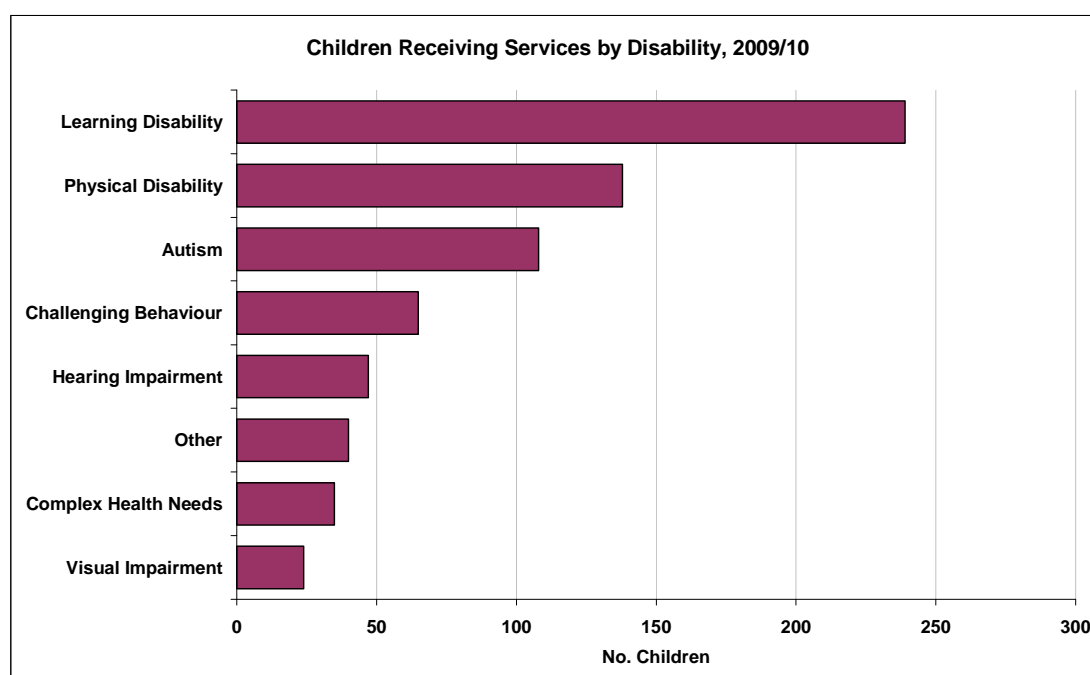

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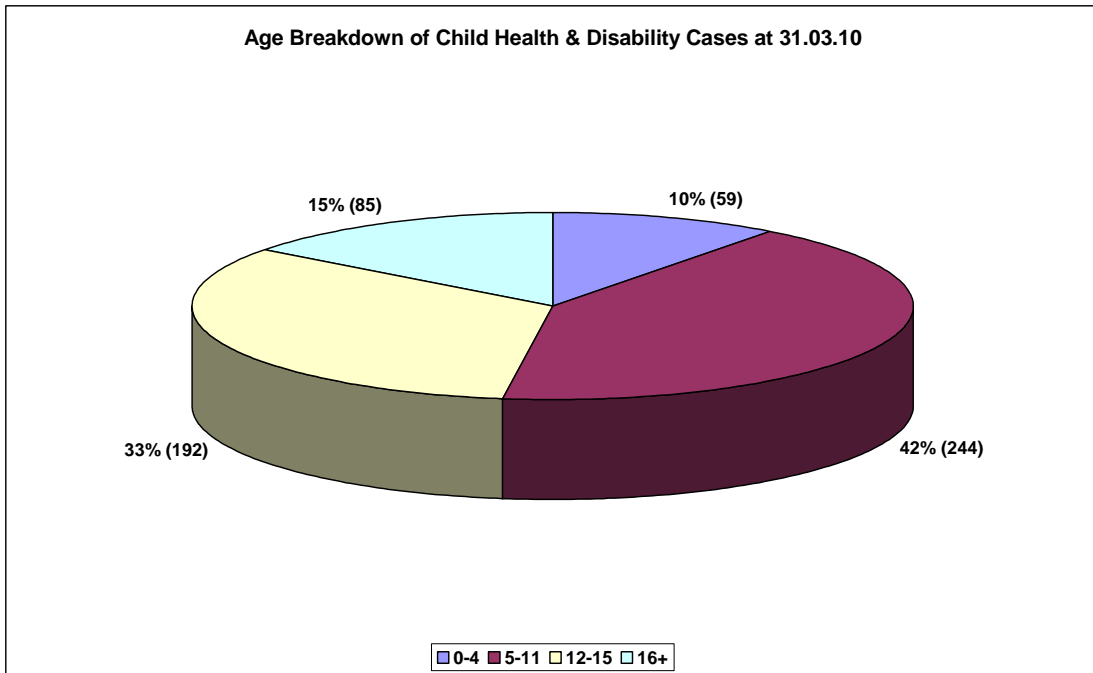
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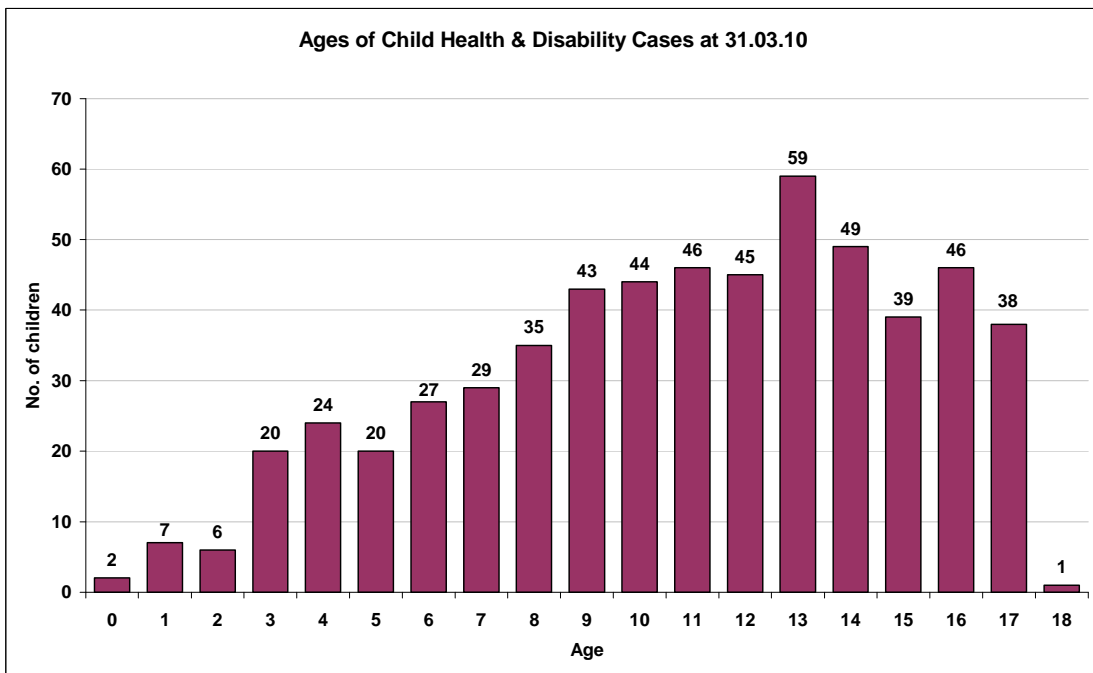
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The age groupings of children being seen by the Child Health and Disability Team at the end of March 2010 can be seen in the charts below. More than two-fifths of the cases are aged 5-11 (42%) while a further third are aged 12-15.

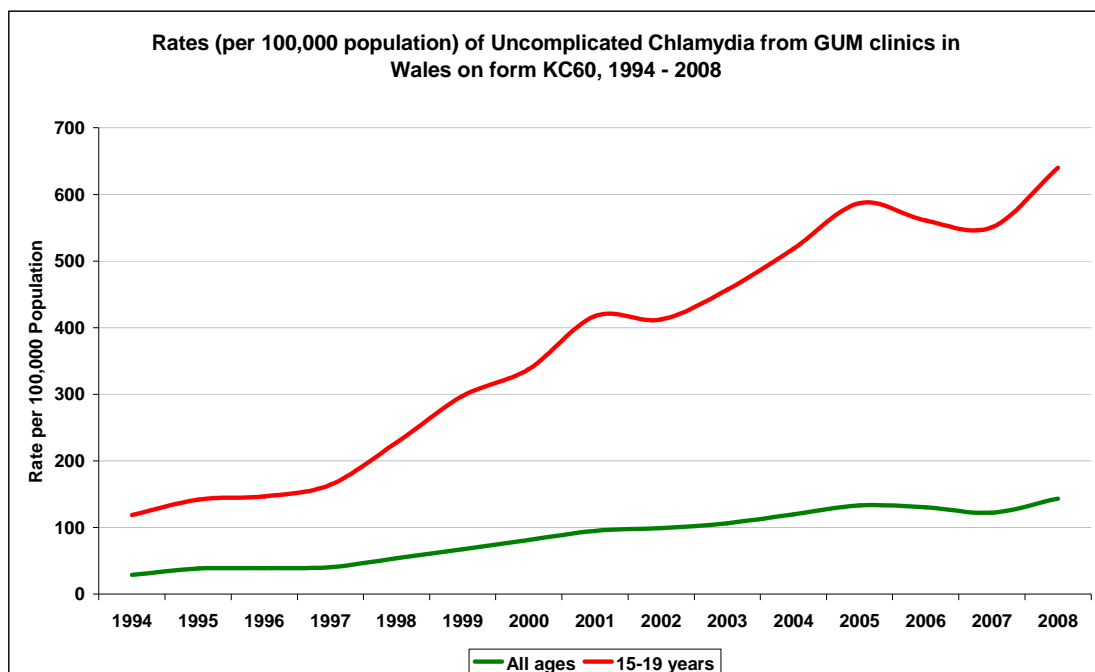

Sexually Transmitted Infections

The chart below shows the rates of uncomplicated chlamydia infection in Wales between 1994 and 2008 for all aged and people aged 15 to 19. Although both age groups have followed an upward trend over the period, partly reflecting increased awareness and improved diagnostic techniques, the rate for those aged 15 to 19 has increased more quickly and has consistently been above the figure for all ages.

The rate for the 15-19 population increased from 118.9 per 100,000 people in 1994 to 640.1 in 2008. In comparison, all ages saw a smaller rise from 29.1 to 143.7.
