<p>BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED AREA OF WORK TO BE SUPPORTED:</p> <p>Build on highly successful collaborative approach of centrality of information and advice services available to young people aged 11-25 in Cardiff, in easily accessible available formats that young people respond to.</p> <p>Youth information is central to the Children and Young People’s Partnership in that it informs young people and those working with young people of agencies that provide quality services for young people in Cardiff and cuts across all core groups.</p> <p>Building upon a successful local model sitting in context of the WAG model includes; development of a robust database, development of a range of dissemination/access and engagement tools and mechanisms including an interactive information website, events and youth magazine, and targeted work with ‘harder to reach’ groups of young people taking forward recommendations from commissioned research.</p> <p>Focus and resource will be placed on developing the youth information database in line with the Family information Service (FIS), working with both organisations and young people to ensure it contains quality information on support services available to young people (aged 11-25) displayed in a variety of accessible formats led by young people.</p> <p>Links with National Policy driven by WAG in terms of information and advice policy and the needs of young people. Close working relationship with the Family Information Service (FIS) to ensure a comprehensive information service for children and young people aged 0-25 and their families. This includes developing the welsh element with the view of providing all information bilingually.</p>

MAIN PROPOSED OUTCOMES FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE: How would these be measured? Which outcomes in the CYP Plan do these link with? These outcomes link with priority outcomes 13 and 14 in the CYP Plan. 1. Improved access to quality information and advice services available to young people (aged 11-25) in Cardiff. This will be measured by monitoring and evaluation forms, questionnaires and workshops (using commissioned research as a baseline) and online satisfaction and effectiveness surveys. 2. The ability to map and manipulate organisations information (from the database) will inform elements of service provision, allow comparisons of services, report writing, and highlight ways in which services review themselves promoting good practice, participation of young people in service delivery and identifying gaps in services provided for young people (aged 11-25) in Cardiff. 3. Increased partnership knowledge & understanding of support services provision for young people improving service delivery & strategic planning. 4. The web based interactive platform (and magazine) led by young people allows for direct involvement and development by young people in youth information provision, opportunities to submit articles, express views, develop skills and access training. Measured by submissions, Editorial Group involvement, online satisfaction surveys and number of young people receiving training. 5.
